Started in 1988, on Sunday 13th August the Flower Show held its 34th show in 36 years. The two missing years were due to the recent Covid pandemic.

This year's show was another success with a significant number of people in the village and surrounding area entering a flower show for the first time. Whilst entries from children and for the handicraft continued to increase we saw a large drop in the cut flower category. This could be accounted for by the dismal weather in July, but one of the major factors was the sad death in November of Tom Nelson who, despite living in Cupar, was a long time supporter of our flower show, and seemed to hold the cut flower trophy as his own. Tom is a sad loss to our show and it is our intention to present a new trophy next year in his honour.

Despite the success of our show it is a sad fact that many gardening clubs and flower shows are folding and we are keen that ours does not become such a casualty. As I look around the village there is a significant number of beautiful gardens and vegetable patches with the produce that would win prizes. The flower show takes a lot of work to put on and we are keen that the village will be able to say in another thirty-six years that it still has a flower show.

I would like to thank all those who entered the different categories and those who came in the afternoon to support the show. Mostly my thanks to the team who made it happen, and I invite you to join us for the next one on Sunday 11th August 2024.

Nomination



WORLD MISSION REPORT JULY 2023

Mission Aviation Fellowship or MAF for short is a Christian organization reaching men, women and children in more than



23 countries. Operating more than 120 aircraft, MAF's pilots overcome terrain that has become inaccessible due to derelict roads, natural disaster or violent conflict. Aircraft fly into more than 1,000 destinations transporting food, water, health professionals and medical supplies and emergency workers and Christian missionaries where they are needed most. Each flight brings practical help, spiritual hope and physical healing to thousands of isolated people and people in remote communities.

MAF UK is a member of MAF International (MAFI) which has its UK HQ in Folkestone, but MAF Scotland is a semi-autonomous organisation based in Glasgow.

To give an idea of the scope of MAF UK, its expenditure budget for the year end 31/12/22 was £17,123,000 and it raised £15,973,000 and drew £1,151000 from reserves to balance the books. It depends on individual donations, legacies, trusts donations from churches, companies and governments. Letham's contribution this year was about £200 from the coffee morning held in April 2023.

Until recently, Letham's mission partners were the Swanson family in Uganda whose tour of duty ended in 2022 and our new partners are the Jack family (also from Glasgow) who will have an enhanced role in Uganda. Previously they served in Arnhem Land (Northern Australia).

Disturbing news reached us in March that Ryan and Annabel Koher, MAF workers in Mozambique , had been imprisoned, probably for political reasons connected with the domestic politics of that country but not for anything the couple had done wrong. Mercifully they have now been released from jail but are still detained in Mozambique pending the resolution of legal proceedings. MAF asks that we continue to pray for their total acquittal.

Recent news from MAF announces a new initiative in Guinea in West Africa where MAF have previously not been active and renews the emphasis of work in Timor Leste (a former Portuguese colony near the Philippines) struggling to cope with the after-effects of a brutal invasion by its larger neighbour, Indonesia. The current report from MAF also underlines the continuing good work being done in Papua New Guinea.

PRESBYTERY OF PERTH

The Presbytery of Perth was created on January 1st 2023 and is an amalgamation of the former Presbyteries of Angus, Dundee, Dunkeld & Meigle, Perth and Stirling. There are nine new Presbyteries in the Church of Scotland, with the tenth one to be called Clèir Eilean Ì (Highlands and Hebrides), which will be formed on January 1st 2024.

Perth is a large Presbytery geographically with an area of nearly ten thousand square kilometres and the population is around 510,000. There are 39,304 church members in the Presbytery, which represents just under 8% of the population. It contains 168 congregations and there are 77 ministers in charges, with many others serving Presbytery as Ordained Local Ministers, Deacons, Ministry Development Staff, Readers, Chaplains, Worship Leaders and other roles.

The Presbytery meets four times a year and sometimes requires to have extra meetings. We either meet online or in person and we're looking to have hybrid meetings in the future.

We have been slowly building up a team, with Ed Morton, our Administrator, having been appointed in January. Rhona Nicol, the Presbytery Treasurer, is also employed as the Congregational Support Officer and Rhona is keen to offer help in areas such as finance and safeguarding. We have just appointed Ruth Rankin as the Communications Officer and will shortly be interviewing for a Buildings Officer.

I see the role of Presbytery as being there to enable congregations to undertake the vital work of the Kingdom and I hope that people will see it as a body that's there to support them. This is, of course, challenging at a time when the Presbytery Mission Planning process involves some difficult decisions, including the closure of many buildings.

The priority for the Presbytery is mission – we seek to support and resource congregations so that they can grow and flourish as part of the Kingdom of God. The Five Marks of Mission ought to be at the heart of everything that we do.

I hope that you will view Presbytery as being there to offer support, encouragement and a sense of direction as we seek to be the Church in these challenging times.

Free, local information to help you tackle the Cost of Living Crisis

With the price of most things going up it is important to "make every penny count" and also to make good use of the things that you already have. Information, ideas and inspiration are available at Forfar Library and online.

"Forfar Library has been selected as one of the first in Scotland to host a 'Lend and Mend Hub', as part of a trailblazing pilot project helping to tackle the cost-of-living crisis." ⁽¹⁾

The library has access to new (and older) books that can help reduce the cost of living. Topics include:

- Making new clothes, upcycling and mending clothes, using a sewing machine, knitting
- * DIY
- * Cooking (e.g. budget cooking, batch cooking)
- * Money tips
- * Gardening (e.g. growing your own food in containers)

These books are all free to borrow by members of the library and some of them are available online. They may also be available from the mobile library. (Note: books may be out on loan but can be reserved.)



The "Lend and Mend Hub" is open (to members of ANGUSalive libraries) with free access to equipment so you can repair, reuse and upcycle your things in Forfar Library. The equipment includes sewing machines, an embroidery machine, an overlocker (for seams and edges), a table, other sewing equipment and mannequins available in Forfar Library. To use the space everyone must undertake an initial brief safety induction - to book an induction please email LendandMendInduction@angusalive.scot or telephone 01307 492121.



Red Castle



Red Castle, an impressive but shattered ruinous old stronghold, once a large and strong castle held by the Barclays, Stewarts and Beatons, in a prominent spot near the sea some miles from Montrose and near Lunan in Angus in northeast Scotland.

Restricted Access

Following a recent mound landslip in March 2021 at Redcastle, Angus Council surveyed the historic site and concluded that the recent slope failures between the north-eastern corner of the Redcastle tower and the bank of the Lunan Water present a present danger to the public, should there be further more catastrophic landslips, or should these landslips lead to the collapse of the Red Castle tower. As a consequence, safety fencing and warning signage has been erected and Angus Council are liaising with the landowner.

Access from the bank of Lunan Water is to be avoided. Get the best views of Red Castle Ruin from the Estuary at Lunan Water. Flying drones over and around Red Castle is not permitted without prior authorisation from the Red Castle landowner and should be avoided during the breeding season of the fulmars who nest in the ruin from early January to late September.

The nearest car parking to Red Castle is Lunan Bay car park on the North side of the Bay.
