

Meditation

Reading: Isaiah 40: 9-11, 29-31

Isaíah 40:31

Isaiah 40 carries the title, in some versions, "Comfort for God's people", and indeed, this chapter has no doubt been a source of comfort to many of us in difficult days. The context is, of course, the Jewish people in exile who were in great need of comfort. Their freedom was greatly restricted in a land where God's name and values were not respected. Psalm 137 contains their lament, which many people only know from the Boney M song "By the rivers of Babylon" - "How can we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?".

You will have noticed that our country is rapidly becoming a "strange land" where Christian principles are constantly under attack, sometimes from surprising sources. That's why this chapter is so relevant to us today as we try to come to terms with living in a world where God's name and values are less and less considered to be important or even necessary. It's all too easy to get disappointed and discouraged, so Isaiah 40 brings us comfort and encouragement as we borrow God's promises from it and apply them to our lives today.

We could say there are three voices in this chapter, each of which brings encouragement to us when we apply them to ourselves:

- (1-5) The voice of comfort.
- (6-8) The voice of confidence.
- (9-11) The voice of conquest.

The chapter culminates with a mighty encouragement to those who are feeling the burden of the way. Read verses 29-31.

Good News for Everyone (GFNE) continues a longstanding ministry of supplying free Bibles. We believe that the Bible does indeed have good news of God's love for us all through Jesus Christ. Everyone should have the opportunity to read their own copy of God's word.

We seek to distribute scriptures in schools, colleges and universities; hotels and B&Bs; work places; sports clubs; care homes; and at national and local events.

Bibles and New Testaments are produced in many formats to connect with people from different walks of life. New Testaments may have for example a Fire Service badge or the logo of a football club. Large print versions are available for care home residents or anyone with impaired sight. A recent innovation is the Hope Magazine which presents John's gospel and selected Psalms in a bright magazine style. We also have a supply of these in Ukrainian.

Recently we have also published a magazine called 'Discover' which is a colourful and interactive tool for teaching the Bible to primary age children.

GNFE also has a worldwide ministry of Bible distribution working in partnership with Shareword Global.

PRESBYTERY MISSION PLAN

Going Forward together....

Perhaps you are wondering about what is happening following all the discussions and proposals that were taking place last year regarding church unions and buildings closing in this area? Or perhaps you are well informed, not only about the local area but the wider situation in Scotland too? Whichever it is, this is the first of a series of updates on what is taking place in the Church of Scotland in the Forfar area.

To maximise the many talents and time of many committed volunteers and to rationalise costs, two larger parishes will be created. The congregations of Forfar East & Old will unite with the congregations of Inverarity and Kinettles to become the parish of Forfar East and Old and Inverarity.

The parishes of Aberlemno, Guthrie and Rescobie, Dunnichen, Letham and Kirkden, Forfar Lowson Memorial and Forfar St Margaret's will also unite. A transition team with representatives from each of these congregations is in place and will be working on the legal paperwork necessary but also on bringing people together to resolve the practicalities of how to optimise gifts and skills to complement one another and better serve our community.

There will also be preparations for the closure of the buildings of Forfar St Margaret's, and Guthrie. A time of sadness but also of thanksgiving for their history and their people – a story which continues in the larger group.

Over the next few months there will be opportunities to get involved – for example we need to choose a new name for the united parish, joint events to attend, publications to read that explain exactly what is happening and, if you're a church member the chance to have your say and vote. In the next update we'll give you a progress report and a proposed timeline. Please look out for these and if you have any questions speak to an Elder who'll be able to give you more details. Please also pray for those who have volunteered to be a part of the transition team – it's exciting but daunting work and they are the catalyst for the start of something new.

Harvest Thanksgiving

This year's Harvest Thanksgiving service will be on Sunday, 8th October, 2023.

All food donations will go to Dundee & Angus Foodbank, for use with families in this area.

All financial contributions will be sent to the Ekwendeni Mission Hospital in Malawi.

While most people know about the Foodbanks the Ekwendeni Mission Hospital is less well known.

Ekwendení Mission Hospital

Ekwendeni Mission Hospital is in the northern part of Malawi, about thirteen miles from the nearest city, Mzuzu. It serves an area that includes 372



villages in a rural area where the economy is based on subsistence farming.

The hospital is one of the oldest mission hospitals in Malawi. The hospital has 183 beds, serving a catchment area of 45,000 with a wider referral area of 120,000 people. The hospital employs 170 staff and sees over 21,000 out-patients every year, of which over 7,000 are usually admitted. Ekwendeni Hospital also accommodates 3,000 births a year.


