CONGREGATIONAL REPORT 2023 **PUBLICITY GROUP**

The Publicity Group co-ordinates the funding, production and distribution of "*In the PICTure*" – our church and community newsletter.

Over the years, more and more local organisations have taken the opportunity offered by "*In the PICTure*" to publicise their activities or special events either via an article, or an advert or sometimes through a special leaflet inserted into the magazine. We would be very pleased to add more community information in future editions.

Another aspect which will develop over the coming months relates to our impending Union with other local churches. It is not yet clear what that will mean for the various publications involved, but "*In the PICTure*" is likely to exist for some time to come yet.....

1,000 copies of the magazine are printed 10 times a year, and delivered free of charge to all households in the parish, thanks to our volunteer distributors to whom we extend our grateful thanks as always.

Those who live outwith the Parish and have requested a copy are sent an electronic pdf version.

Our usual activities were all successfully implemented again this year: delivery of an Easter Card with the March edition; updated copies of the "In the Know" leaflet aimed at providing useful information for both newcomers to the village and more long term residents going out with the September edition, and in October we organise the annual Envelope Appeal, which (assisted by Gift Aid) brings in a huge contribution towards the printing costs of the magazine – which are currently £259.22 per month, quite a large sum.

But we could not achieve a satisfactory funding situation without our 15 loyal sponsors - the local businesses who financially support the magazine ensuring that "*In the PICTure*" is self-sufficient, and not a drain on the Church's resources. Indeed it is a net contributor to church funds.

The work involved in collating, editing, liaising with sponsors and occasional advertisers, proofreading, bundling and delivering would not be possible without the commitment of our team who are Rev Martyn Thomas, Joan Smith, Elaine Saunders, Margaret Moore, Richard Moore and Irene McGugan.

Finally a huge thank you to all who support this significant outreach initiative of the Church.

But, since being home, I'm not bitter with them for shooting me. God saved me, and I have forgiven them.'

This is one of the many stories of many countries in which Missionary Aviation Fellowship works.

For sixteen years, a small four-legged friend walked the halls of the dementia specialist care home, St Margaret's House in Polmont.



Rosie first came to St Margaret's House at twelve weeks old, along with her twin sister Amber. The pair were loved by many and known as "professional beggars" with a passion for

pink wafers.

Rosie was left to carry out her care dog duties alone when Amber passed away from cancer in 2021, aged 15. Over the years, Rosie brought joy to the residents. On the days she was not there, her absence was noticeable with residents expressing they missed her.



Her skilled begging tactics never deteriorated with age as she welcomed all visitors cheerfully whilst leading them to the office where her treats were kept.

Sadly, Rosie passed away peacefully in August 2023, aged 16. However, her years of dedicated service will not be forgotten nor will her impact on the atmosphere of the home and the joy she brought to those that met her.
