Letham Primary School to receive prestigious UNICEF UK Award (cont.)



Forfar All Souls - Union of Churches: WHERE ARE WE NOW?

On Sunday January 28th, all 6 congregations voted in favour of the Union. Since then plans have been progressing, culminating in the SERVICE OF UNION, a Presbytery led event held on 21st March in Lowson Memorial Church (the largest venue).

The Union proper takes effect from 1st April.

From this time, St Margaret's Church in Forfar will close, as will Guthrie Church, and very soon thereafter Rescobie Church will no longer host services either. There will be 3 remaining places of worship in the Union: Aberlemno, Letham and Lowson Memorial Churches.

A joint meeting of all Kirk Sessions took place on 15th February in Letham Church and will be followed up by another such meeting on 14th April. Elders will be appointed to the Leadership Team and other roles assigned and tasks allocated. Further work will be done on aligning our practices and working out the way forward together, which will be challenging and complex in many regards. It should be remembered however that the Church, locally and nationally, has undergone and survived many changes and challenges in its very long history.

As may be imagined, the number of Elders in this joint Kirk Session is quite large, but it is anticipated that a number will take this opportunity to step back. Indeed the DLK Kirk Session has been reduced by 6. Ms. Gelda Pryde, Mrs. Isabel Morrison and Mr. Bill Sturrock have each given very long and dedicated service to our church, for which they have our grateful thanks and eternal appreciation. Understandably they now feel that they would like to "retire". Mrs. Margaret Moore and Mr. Richard Moore have also stepped back and we thank them also for their significant contributions to Church life. We wish them all well in the future. And finally Rev Martyn Thomas no longer wishes to be a "Retired Minister associated with the Kirk Session", but despite this, he remains active in leading worship from time to time, and editing "In the PICTure".

There are currently 8 remaining Elders: Mrs. Irene McGugan (Session Clerk), Mrs. Elaine Saunders (Treasurer), Mr. I Niven (Fabric Convenor), Mrs. Norma Craigon (Safeguarding Coordinator), Mrs. Jane Nicolson, Mrs Maureen Buwert, Mr. David Lumgair and Rev Klaus Buwert.

From April the Team Ministry takes over and will be providing worship at Letham (and the other 2 churches) every Sunday. They are Rev Dr Karen Fenwick, Rev Maggie Hunt and Rev Heather Gourlay. We look forward to welcoming them to Letham Church. Kirk Session In the PICTure Page 5

TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 3

"I've seen many a ruined building, but never a ruined stane." (Hugh McDiarmid)

OOR STANE FAE LANG SYNE

There is a muckle stane guarding the busy northern entrance to Letham Village on Auldbar Road. It is known as The Girdle Stane, and lies just south of the junction leading west to Dunnichen and east towards the old Chapelton Farm House.

This big Girdle Stane was moved some years ago from its original spot just on the actual junction where 40 tonne lorries and other vehicles used to drive over the stone. It was feared that the ancient "cup and ring" markings could be erased forever unless traffic running over the stone could be stopped. So it was moved to save it.

Called a "cup and ring" stone, one of a handful or thereby, they are believed to be 3,500 years old. That was before the pyramids were built. They are to be found all over Scotland and the best theory is that they were ancient land boundary markers. But who knows?

Anyway, the village of Letham lays claim to our Auld Stane. Our forebears in this place who had that stone so long ago must surely be saluted and must know we are guarding their ancient property
