Youth and Safeguarding Report - March 2024

As I explained last year, the General Assembly of 2022 agreed substantial reform of Safeguarding Training for everyone working or holding positions within the Church of Scotland. This has been implemented over the last year.

There is now a requirement for all elders to undergo a 3 hour safeguarding training course every 5 years. Those people who have undergone PVG checking, to allow them to work with children and other vulnerable groups, must do an additional short training course to ensure they are kept up to date with all the current guidelines and practice.

The elders here in Letham, who currently serve on the kirk session, have now completed all the necessary courses. The courses were very well run and highlight the importance of everyone being vigilant in dealings with children and other vulnerable groups.

We have several people who have completed the PVG checking process. As of 1st April 2024, we will be part of Forfar - All Souls Church of Scotland and we are looking forward to some changes in the way we worship. There will be opportunities for more people to become involved in new initiatives, working with children and other vulnerable groups, in Letham and Forfar. Our next event is a plant sale in the village hall on Saturday 11th May from 10am to noon.



TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 4

"I've seen many a ruined building,

but never a ruined stane." (Hugh McDiarmid)

SMOOTH PASSAGE FOR THE COACH

Aye, it's aboot stanes again!!

We Lethamites may imagine that cassie stanes only featured in Letham but recently, with the installation of the flower beds in The Square. However, only a few villagers know that old cassie stanes of long ago can be found in The Den. Many fowk will truly say they have never seen cassies anywhere in The Den. This claim demands an explanation. Here follows that explanation.

When the village was founded in 1789, there was little means of instant communication. Scotland did not employ jungle drums or smoke signals, or long horns like the Swiss. Nor did there exist, telephones. Communications had to be face to face. Enter the Arbroath to Brechin daily coach service. This coach came through the new village of Letham. Entering the village via Grant Roy's Brae, it then crossed the Vinney just upstream of the bridge which is there now. But the bridge wasn't even built when the coach began to run.

Blunt Neuk, where Isobel Sword now stays, used to function as a sort of motorway cafe to service the drouthy and hungry passengers travelling past. When I came to the village in 1947, it was still possible to see parts of an ancient notice painted on the wall of Blunt Neuk. "Wines and Spirits" could still be discerned. I dare say that ham and eggs and scotch broth also featured on the Menu. The name Blunt Neuk gives the name away. The gable end at the side of the Burn is rounded to allow the coach to emerge from the burn without colliding with the gable. There followed a gey, stey brae before the coach could enter the end of Blairs Road at The Hedges. No wonder the human contents of the coach partook of a pech at Blunt Neuk. I bet the horses enjoyed the rest as well.

But to return to the cassies in The Den. They are in the Burn, just upstream from the new bridge. The land on the south side of the Burn slopes from the road to the Burn. Some serious howking amongst the stones in the Burn reveals a perfectly smooth road of cassies, to ease the passage of the coach.
