FIRST STAGE OF PRIMARY BUILDING COMPLETED

In our last newsletter we reported that the first phase of the building of the Primary School had started. At that time the building team were clearing the ground and preparing to dig the foundations. The plan was to initially build a two

classroom block that would be added to year on year until the entire school was completed. This year we can report that our friends in Kaleo have managed to go beyond their original plans and have completed a three classroom block. Under the organisation of the team leader Prosper, they were able to build the three classroom block within their original budget. They have also managed to construct the first toilet block for the students. The first two classes of the Primary School, that had been using temporary accommodation, were able to move in to their new purpose built classrooms immediately on completion. The remaining classroom will house the third year as from September 2015.



DROUGHT HITS KALEO

The rainy season is late starting in Kaleo. After a brief spell of rain in April the farmers planted their crops, but the rains stopped and now their crops are dying. This has resulted in the prices of food rising in the markets. The dam which supplies water for irrigation, and also for the building work, is dry. This again goes to show the hardship of life in northern Ghana. Due to there being no

water in the dam the building work on the Primary School has had to stop temporarily. Fortunately the piped water to Pastor Solomon's house is still running and this is being used to both cook the school meals and as the students' drinking water. The water, however, has to be carried over half a mile to the school. We are all praying that the rains will come soon.

The second phase of construction started earlier this year with the clearing of ground, digging out trees and preparing for the foundations to be laid. The plan is to construct a further block of three classrooms plus a second toilet block. The final phase of the construction will be to provide a teachers' room, a cookhouse and any other finishing touches.





NEWSWORTHY


