Stewardship of our leisure time

I commend enjoyment, for there is nothing better for people under the sun than to eat, and drink, and enjoy themselves, for this will go with them in their toil through the days of life that God gives them under the sun. **Ecclesiastes 8:15**

Busy-ness keeps us from living with joy and peace in today's 24/7 world, but Scripture reminds us that this is hardly new. Ecclesiastes was written some 2,500 years ago! Ecclesiastes does not give license for mindless pleasure-seeking, but rather affirms that our hard work should be balanced with time for relaxation and enjoyment with friends and family.

Saints and mystics have long touted the need for rest and renewal. In the monastic tradition it's referred to as *otium sanctum* – Holy Leisure. Not just wasting our free time, but using it for renewal. As steward/disciples, we aim to use our leisure time wisely. Here are some ideas:

Keep the Sabbath: God actually *commands* us to stop working one day per week, as Exodus 20:8-11 makes clear. But there is no prohibition against leisure. (Why else would God give us a day off?)

Plan your vacation: Even if you're taking a STAYcation, *plan* your time for maximum rest and enjoyment.

Manage your schedule: Are you a slave to your appointment book, driven by *other people's* priorities? Put yourself first – scheduling in time for leisure. Even if it's just 30 minutes here and there!

Find an activity you like: What do you do just for you? Discover – or REdiscover – what brings you joy, then make time to do it.

Socialize: Friends and family make life enjoyable. Spend time with them.

Invest, don't waste, time: Many activities pass the time but don't give back much in renewal or refreshment. Choose activities wisely.

God expects us to work, but not work ourselves to death. Sabbath and leisure time provide means for us to find balance in our life, as well as friendship, love, renewal and purpose.




Thank you to everyone who helped with the Adopt a Highway cleaning of the ditch along Highway 12. You are appreciated.

Received this letter from our Missionary. KLC has been assigned a new Missionary couple: Rev. Dr. Philip J. and Lou Knutson serving in Southern Africa to continue the ELCA's commitment to accompanying our companions.

Greetings in Christ!

As of July 15th, I will no longer serve as an ELCA missionary. I write these words sitting in my apartment in Kenya, quite dusty from my last visit over a year ago. It is set up looking like a place left in a hurry. I saw this before when I served in New Orleans, about two years after the storm. We would still find houses untouched, apartments left as if they were coming back tomorrow. You can tell I did the last bit of dishes; I hung some rags to dry, picked up a little and left long ago March 2020. I believed it would only be a few months at most. Now as I open drawers, I see the clothes I have not worn in over a year, the things I forgot I even had brought with me as I contemplate what can make the trip and what will be left behind.

There is definitely a feeling of sadness as I wrap this long and flexible four-year journey. I started in Southern Africa with Young Adults and Global Mission and journeying through Tanzania hoping to continue the program. Then when YAGM Southern Africa was finished I went to Kenya. Serving as the Lead Pastor to Nairobi International Lutheran Congregation was an in-person job, until myself and many others serving overseas were brought home for Covid 19. I have continued to serve in a long-distance capacity, but this will end July 15th.

No one could have predicted my last four years, and no one could have predicted our last year and a half. Yet amidst all of the switches and the unexpected, the constant has always been your love and support. There was love and support from the people and churches we worked with in all these countries. But the continued love and support from congregations like yours was of great importance. And I know I was not the great communicator, but I promise you, your support was felt. There are churches in Africa giving thanks for the ELCA and all her members. I know this, because I have brought greetings on our behalf to churches and leaders in five different countries over these last four years. I have been given hospitality because of the long-standing relationships our church has created. There were many who came before me and I trust more will come after me, which will continue to serve the ELCA, but also the greater church, a church without walls, without borders.

I pray as I finish my time, you will continue to support the good work the ELCA does in overseas mission. I pray you will consider giving to other missionaries like me who can only exist because of the commitments of others. Commitments to a greater church.

I give thanks for you all, I give thanks for our partners, and I give thanks for the good work we do together. May God bless you in your ministries, as we all journey forward from this pandemic.
