Kerkhoven Lutheran Church Meeting Minutes

The Kerkhoven Lutheran Church council met on 8/4/2021 at 7:30 pm in the KLC fellowship hall.

President Ted Almen called the meeting to order.

Devotions were read by Alison Nelson August Devotions: Scott Mitteness

KLC Mission statement was read in unison.

The secretary's report was read and accepted as written. Susan Nelson/Ann Hanson

The Financial report was read and accepted as written. Scott Mitteness/Ross Carlson

Board Reports

Worship and Witness - Sue Nelson.

The board expressed their thanks for the many volunteers who signed up to participate in Sunday Worship. The month of August slate is complete. The board will continue to pass the sign up during worship service to help fill upcoming months. Pastor Tim will be back on Swpt. 5th and the board has Pastor Carlton Nelson present for communion on Aug. 15th. They are working on filling in people to lead portions of the services while pastor Tim is out.

Compensation for our musicians was discussed and agreed that we are not paying as much as other churches. The board expressed their appreciation and a motion to increase the pay to \$50 per service was made by Christy Nystrom, second by Ann Hanson. Motion carried.

The board shared the upcoming changes to worship service including:

- 1. Ushers will bring the offering plate to the front of the sanctuary during offertory music.
- 2. Communion will be received at the communion railing at least one Sunday each month beginning in September. Communion wafers will be served beginning in September.
- 3. Two services will be held on Confirmation Sunday, Oct. 31. Traditional service at 9 am and confirmation service at 10:45 am

Outreach and Evangelism - Alison Nelson

The backpack program continued through the summer. More help has arrived and more will always be welcome.

A presentation and much discussion followed regarding a welcome bag for visitors and potential new members as a form of outreach. Questions remained regarding what content to include, budget, who would be responsible for giving them out and how to follow up. The board will look into more ideas and will present again at the September meeting.

Christian Education - Jesse Nelson

The board met with Pastor Tim and we have a confirmation schedule set. Grades 6-8 will meet at 6 pm, gr. 9-10 at 7 pm and gr. 11 at 8 pm. An informational meeting with families and mentors will be set.

New Sunday School curriculum has been ordered and classes will be split into four age groups. Eight teachers (4 teams of 2) will be needed to fill teaching spots.

The board will be issuing bibles to KLC youth to get us caught up from last year.

Rally Sunday will be Sept. 12th.

Stewardship and Finance - no members present.

Property and Grounds - no members present.

WELCA - no members present.

Ted Alem shared a request that the board hold a vote to have the library used as a storage area for the quilters. WELCA provided several valid reasons for the space to be designated. Discussion followed on how the room has also been used by other groups and was tabled until more information on the use of the space could be gathered.

Loretta Falk will head up table fair this fall.

Pastor's report - Not present

Ted Alemn shared the pastor's report with the board.

Pastor worked in partnership with the ministerial to hold the community service in the park.

Confirmation schedule is complete.

Communion has been given to those unable to attend church service.

Encourages the board to fix missing information on the church profile, pass and submit so we are able to continue with the call process.

Pastor will be gone during January, February and March.

Old Business

- 1. Offering income is doing well and we have paid bills and have money in the checking account.
- 2. We are waiting to coordinate a defibrillator order with the City of Kerkhoven for better pricing. Money has been donated to replace the current outdated defibrillator. Training would be needed and community education could be a source for training.

New Business

1. The board reviewed the church site profile and a motion was made to accept the profile and submit it to the Synod (Scott Mitteness/Sue Nelson). Motion carried.

SUNDAY - SEPTEMER 12, 2021

The noisy offering for September will be gathered on Sunday, September 12, during the worship service. This offering is designated for the KMS Backpack project.



Be to me a rock of refuge, a strong fortress, to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress" (Psalm 71:3).

Dear friends,

The headlines are filled with the devastation from Hurricane Ida, which made landfall near New Orleans on Aug. 30 — exactly 16 years after Hurricane Katrina. As a strong Category 4 storm, Hurricane Ida's 150 mph winds, torrential rain and strong storm surge caused widespread flooding and wind damage in southeastern Louisiana and coastal Mississippi. Homes are flooded and residents are awaiting rescue, which is hampered by the high waters and debris-clogged roads. Strong winds knocked out power lines and electrical substations, leaving more than 1 million people without power, including the entirety of New Orleans. In some areas, electricity is not expected to be restored for weeks. Ida weakened into a tropical storm as it moved inland and will likely cause heavy flooding in Mississippi, Alabama, and the Tennessee and Upper Ohio valleys.

The impact of Ida is yet to be fully assessed, but with a hurricane of this scale, rebuilding will be costly and take years. With extensive experience in accompanying communities throughout the relief and long-term recovery phases, Lutheran Disaster Response is working with local ELCA synods and Lutheran social service organizations to coordinate a response to Hurricane Ida. Immediate needs will include food, basic necessities and temporary housing. Long after the headlines change, Lutheran Disaster Response will continue to accompany communities on the journey of rebuilding their homes and lives.

Your gifts will support survivors of Hurricane Ida. Gifts to "U.S. Hurricanes" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by hurricanes until the response is complete.

We pray that God's presence will be felt in the midst of suffering and bring comfort to those who are hurting. Together, we can show our neighbors that they are not alone.
