The purpose of the Interest Groups shall be in accordance with the objectives of WCP and governed by the Bylaws. Participation in these groups is limited to paid members. New Interest Groups shall be formed by member(s)' request to the board of directors with the names of no fewer than eight members who are interested in joining the interest group. Each Interest Group is financially independent and has a leader. The leader coordinates the meeting times and dates.

Sometimes an interest group is at capacity. For example, euchre groups are usually 8 or 12 players. It's the nature of the game that requires a specific number. However, substitutes are needed!

Another example might be book clubs. These groups are kept at a smaller number in order to facilitate discussions as well as meeting location limitations.

Angels Making Blankets (AMB): With three teams, our group completes fleece blankets for children entering foster care. The hope is to warm the heart of every child with their own blanket for a feeling of comfort, security and a smile. These blankets are a physical expression to let the children know they have value and are loved. The Cutting Crew cuts the fringe on the blankets in their own homes. The Talk and Tie ladies meet the first Thursday each month from 1:30-3:30 to talk and tie the two fringed ends on the blanket and complete a label for each blanket. Then, blankets go to the Sewing Squad, who sew the labels on the blankets in their own homes. Completed blankets are returned to MY Very Own Blanket (MVOB) where they are sent around the country as needed. There is a variable fee per blanket associated with this group. We are a very social, warm, fun loving and generous group of volunteers and hope you will consider joining us.

Bocce Ball: Bocce group will tentatively meet once a month during the fall, spring & summer at Giammarco's, Carsoni's or Kinsale for lunch followed by playing Bocce Ball.

Book Groups: The Book Groups meet monthly to discuss popular books and bestsellers. We alternate among fiction, nonfiction, biographies, and memoirs. The group members choose the books and take turns leading the discussions.

Bridge Groups: Evening Bridge meets on the first Wednesday of the month and is a two-table group of eight experienced players. Each player chooses a month to host in their home. Although the group is at capacity, we always welcome new players to sub. Day Bridge plays on the third Monday of the month in homes. Depending on interest each month, they play two or three tables.

Bunco Group: The Bunco Group meets on the fourth Wednesday of each month during the day. Bunco is a dice game generally played with twelve or more players, divided into groups of four, trying to score points while taking turns rolling three dice in a series of six rounds. A bunco is achieved when a person rolls three-of-a-kind and all three numbers match the round number.

Community Service Group: This group meets at various days and times to participate in a variety of service activities that are beneficial to the people and organizations in the Powell community and surrounding areas. For more than ten years the group has concentrated on volunteering at a local assisted living facility. Projects there include games, creative activities and party celebrations. Actively volunteering at community functions and donating items to charities are also an important part of our purpose. We are looking for new service projects and would like to branch out into other areas of need. Members are encouraged to make suggestions to our group.

Cooking Group: This group meets on the **second Wednesday** of the month from 12:00 to 2:00 pm. We prepare dishes based on a theme for the month. We bring copies of the recipes to share with those in attendance. After eating, we each discuss the recipe we prepared, including any special preparation or ingredients, any changes we made and any challenges encountered in the preparation.

Dinner Divas Group: This lively group meets on the **third Wednesday** of the month at 6:00pm throughout the entire year. Dining out venues are diverse so that a variety of cuisines can be enjoyed. Restaurants often limit group reservations to 20-25 people, so the spots fill up quickly! Most often we are seated at separate tables of 4-6 to make it easier to visit and we are always able to get separate checks. I send out a final confirmation list a few days in advance if you would like to coordinate carpooling with other members who will be attending.

Euchre Group: Euchre is a fast moving, trick-taking card game played with a partial deck of 24 cards. It is not a difficult game to learn so if you are interested in learning or need a refresher, please mark your membership form accordingly. The members of each euchre group have fun playing cards, visiting, and getting to know one another. Members bring \$1.00 to be used as prizes, distribution is determined by each group.

Garden Group: This group meets **various days and times**. They are currently working on a schedule for the year – so check back and see if our ideas have sprouted yet!

Hand Knee and Foot Group: HKF is an easy to learn, fun card game played with multiple decks of cards. While it is primarily a partner game, any number of people can play so no one is left out.

Happy Hour Group: This group meets on the **fourth Friday** of each month at 5:00 pm. We have a happy hour event each month, year-round except for in November and December due to the holidays. We usually will visit a local restaurant in the Powell area that has some happy hour specials, but a few times a year we may venture to a neighboring suburb or even into Columbus proper. Many ladies attending a happy hour event will order dinner, but this is not a requirement to attend, nor is drinking an adult beverage a requirement.

International Cuisine: Columbus and surrounding areas have so much to offer in variety of food. The main focus of this group will be authentic world food like-Greek, Spanish, Asian, Indian, Thai, Latin American, Mediterranean, African etc. If you like to explore and take your taste buds and imagination far and wide then please join this group. Meeting on the 2nd Tuesday of the month for lunch.

Lunch Bunch Groups: We have two Lunch Bunch Groups and many of us are members of both. **We meet at different restaurants at 11:30 am each month**, sometimes local, sometimes a little farther away. Separate checks are always provided by our servers. Some of our members join us on their lunch break because, after all, you have to eat, right?

Music Group: This group meets **various days and times**. We attend a wide variety of musical events, including orchestral, theatrical, vocal group, instrumental, and solo performances. Venues range from local high schools (the spring musicals), to college performance centers, to the Ohio and Southern Theaters in downtown Columbus. Our group samples all types from music – from the Beatles, to Broadway, to Beethoven. If you enjoy music, our group may strike a chord with you!

Nifty Needlers: This group meets on the **first Tuesday** of the month at 1:00 pm. This is an opportunity for members who like to knit, crochet, sew, quilt or embroider to meet monthly with fellow members and share their projects, expertise and creativity. Members take turns hosting the group in their homes.

Out & About: This group meets **various days and times**. We enjoy a wide variety of activities at many different types of venues in the central Ohio area. Whether it be a museum exhibit, a thought-provoking play, a cooking class, or learning to play bocce, the goal is to enjoy each other's company while experiencing something new, different, educational, or simply out of the ordinary.

Paper Arts: This group meets on the **third Tuesday** of the month at Powell United Methodist Church at 1:00 pm. Paper arts is the art form employing paper or cards as the primary artistic medium for the creation of three-dimensional objects. It is the most widely used material in arts and crafts. It lends itself to a wide range of techniques, as it can be folded, cut, glued, molded, stitched, or layered. In addition to making personal projects, members of our Paper Arts group provide all the beautiful programs for our Candy Cane Gala and Spring Fling. We love what we do and the people we do it with. Our main emphasis is on greeting cards but not exclusively. We share new ideas, products and techniques to help grow your paper crafting skills.
