

Elka Watch Co. Debuts New Diver's Watch

Following the successful launch of their first watch line, inspired by the rich past and history of the now-defunct Elka Watch Cy from Amsterdam, the brand is back with a new timepiece. This model stays true to the codes of the young brand and takes the form of a stylish diver's watch. This watch boasts the same dimensions, chevé-box sapphire crystal, lugs shape, and emblematic side edge line as the original series. The watch is adorned with a ceramic ring bezel and superluminova numerals, and is waterresistant to 20 bar (200m). The watch is named after the ancient name of the village of Saint-Blaise, which dates back to the first millennium. This name was chosen for many reasons: the village's location on the shores of Switzerland's Lake Neuchâtel and the region's rich history, which includes the Celts and the Palafittes civilizations. These ancient people built dwellings on the lake's poles to allow for fluctuating water levels. The watch's design is inspired by the region's history, with elements that recall the Celtic wheel found in the lake, the stock of ceramics found at Chemin du Diable in Saint-Blaise, and the lake itself. These elements are reflected in the watch's shape, material used such as the bezel in ceramic.

NATO STRAP

MANY PEOPLE BELIEVE THAT THE NATO BRACELET IS NAMED AFTER THE NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANISATION (NATO). THEREFORE, THE COMMON STORY IS THAT THE WATCH WAS WORN BY NATO FORCES, BUT THIS IS NOT TECHNICALLY THE CASE. IN REALITY, THE NAME IS SHORT FOR NATO STOCKING NUMBER, A TERM THAT SIMPLY REFERS TO THE FACT THAT THE BRACELET COULD BE PURCHASED IN THE NATO SUPPLY SHOP. THE ORIGINAL NATO BRACELET WAS BORN IN 1973 IN RESPONSE TO THE BRITISH MINISTRY OF DEFENCE'S NEED TO PROVIDE A HIGHLY DURABLE WATCH STRAP FOR THE BRITISH ARMY. THE MOD'S OBJECTIVE WAS TO DESIGN A WATCHBAND THAT COULD COPE WITH ALL SITUATIONS. THE AIM WAS TO OVERCOME THE PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED WITH THE BRACELETS OF THE TIME: PROBLEMS WITH MOISTURE ON THE LEATHER IN TROPICAL CLIMATES, THE RISK OF REFLECTION OF THE STEEL BRACELET DURING A MILITARY MISSION, THE POOR RELIABILITY OF RUBBER BRACELETS, AND THE RISK OF LOSING THE WATCH DUE TO THE BREAKAGE OF THE SPRING BARS (INCLUDING THOSE IN THE BUCKLE). THEY WERE ONLY AVAILABLE IN THE COLOUR ADMIRAL GREY AND WERE ALL 20 MILLIMETRES WIDE. THE BRACELETS WERE MADE OF NYLON.



SAPPHIRE CRYSTAL

THE CHEVÉ-BOX SAPPHIRE CRYSTALS ARE THE MOST COMPLICATED VERSION OF WATCH SAPPHIRES, THEY HAVE THE APPEARANCE OF HEZALITE GLASSES MADE IN THE PAST, IT SHOULD BE REMEMBERED THAT THE HARDNESS OF THE SAPPHIRE CRYSTAL IS JUST AFTER THAT OF THE DIAMOND, AT ABOUT 2000 HV.

Despite its vintage look, this is a thoroughly modern bracelet, with easy spring bars and exceptional durability.

The Elka Arinis Vintage Tropic bracelet's small perforations are carefully designed to allow air and water to circulate, offering the wearer great comfort in hot climates. .

The 1950s saw the emergence of the most important diving watches. Primarily instrumental, they were often worn on the wrists of various army corps, such as combat swimmers, at a time when there were no on-board diving electronics.

At the time, diving watches were only fitted with steel straps.

There was a need for a watch strap that was resistant to seawater, and that could be quickly and easily adjusted so that it could be worn either directly on the wrist or over the sleeves of a diving suit.

In the 1960s, Tropic, a leather strap manufacturer, developed a rubber strap to meet the needs of the time.

> The Tropic Classic, designed for diving watches, and the Tropic Sport, for motor racing;

For collectors of vintage watches in general and diving watches in particular, the Tropic Classic bracelet has become as much a standard as the NATO bracelet.

It is worth noting a very important detail that is often missing from contemporary versions of the Tropic Classic.

In keeping with the original Tropic Classic bracelet, the perforations on our bracelet are diamond-shaped on the front, rather than round as in some of today's poor reinterpretations.

In terms of craftsmanship, this is a contemporary version.

Elka Arinis Tropic bracelets are made of vulcanized rubber (called FKM).

 FKM Rubber or Fluoro-Elastomer is an incredibly durable rubber compound that is resistant to salt water, aggressive chemicals and extreme temperatures (as low as -10C and as high as +200C). It is the perfect material for a sophisticated rubber band designed to withstand harsh conditions while looking stylish.

Come discover the depths of celt civilisation on the shore of the lake with your new ELKA Diver's watch. The Arinis watch has been inspired by all the history surrounding the wonderful region of Saint-Blaise. Ceramics was found on an old roman path, imposing the idea of a ceramic made bezel. The old wheel, being a strong and intrinsically regional object, has given it's colour to parts of the collection. The ingraved fishes at the back of the watch are a small hint to the fascinating artifacts found in the lake. A thousand years of history, wrapped around your wrist.

ARINIS



The village of Saint-Blaise was built in the time of Charlemagne (800 AD). It was initially known as Arins, or even Arens, but this was replaced by Saint-Blaise in 1280. The name Arins (Arinis in Latin) appears for the first time in 1011 in a deed by which King Rodolphe III of Burgundy gives his fiancée several towns and villages, including Neuchâtel, Auvernier and Arins. Arins was a favourable location: it was close to the lake, the upper part of the town was in a dominant position and, above all, there was a river, the Ruau, which could be used to power mills and other machinery.



CELTES

An excavation carried out between 1986 and 1988 at the Saint-Blaise site (formerly the Bains des Dames) in a 3,200 m2 polder, uncovered the presence of palafittes dating from the Final Neolithic (2950-2400 BC). A striking discovery was a wooden wheel (2600 BC) considered to be one of the oldest in the world. It appears that the site was inhabited for some 700 years.







AVENTICUM

Aventicum was the capital of Helvetic territory - Occupied since Celtic times, the town became part of the Roman Empire around 15 BC and grew rapidly from the first century AD, particularly after becoming a colony in 71/72 AD. Strategically located thanks to the road and river network, and with a population of up to 20000 inhabitants, Aventicum was one of the most important towns on Swiss territory in Roman times. Today, Avenches is home to the Roman Museum and several of its ancient monuments are still visible.








ROMAN

The construction of the capital of Helvetia required ashlars from Arinis, which were transported down the Devil's Path to the barges - ten trips a day over a period of 10 years.

Some of the barges sank, and are still visible and in a relatively good state of preservation.

CERAMIC

The Devil's Path (Chemin du Diable); A stone-paved Roman road that is still clearly visible and linked the Vy d'Etra (Roman road at the foot of the Jura) to Avenches (Aventicum), the capital of Roman Helvetia. The ruts cut into the stones of the road to allow the passage of standard-gauge chariots are still clearly visible.

At a burial site, dating from 2300 BC, discovered in 1911 not far from the Chemin du Diable, 260 kg of ceramics (800 -700 BC) and a large number of other objects, such as an artefact dating from the Middle Ages. C.) were unearthed at the Roches de Châtoillon during archaeological excavations in 2000. The remains of a Roman villa and inscription along with the presence of the Chemin du Diable and Roman coins and shards at the origin of the place known as "Les Tuiles ou Tioles", near the Chemin des Plaines, attest to a human presence that has certainly not ceased since the existence of the Late Neolithic village.

PALAFITTE



More than a thousand lakeside villages, called palafittes, have been discovered in Switzerland; since 2011, 111 of them have been listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites. In the Three-Lakes region, 22 palafittes are included in this list, and the archaeological research carried out at these sites over the last 150 years has served as a reference point for understanding European prehistory. Along the Neuchâtel coast alone, 70 sites have been identified, containing 123 different villages. In this region, occupation of these wetland habitats spans a period of 3,000 years, between 4,000 and 850 BC. The data gathered during the lake excavations provide a detailed insight into the material culture and settlement layout of these Neolithic and Bronze Age societies.

The new Swiss watch. Born in Amsterdam 150 years ago. ELKA watches are part of a tradition, a lineage and a history. That of a brand founded in 1877 in Amsterdam by Eliazer Kiek, inventor of the tactile watch for the blind and watchmaker to Queen Juliana of the Netherlands. In 1949, the ELKA Watch Company opened its Swiss branch in La Chaux-de-Fonds. (It produced wristwatches, of course, but also pocket watches, Braille watches, chronographs, chess and signal clocks).

Then, in the mid-1970s, the brand disappeared, along with Ernst Louis Kiek, grandson and last heir.
