<u>Senator-At-Large Bolques Comments on Rapid Response of VIFEMS in Recent Fire Incident, Cites Allocation of Funds for New Fire Trucks as Key to Success</u>

VIRGIN ISLANDS – In a commendable demonstration of their efficiency and dedication, the Virgin Islands Fire and Emergency Medical Services (VIFEMS) swiftly responded to a structural fire incident in Enighed, St. John, preventing a potential catastrophe within just one hour of receiving the emergency call. "I felt compelled to champion getting our firemen the best resources available so that our first responders are well-equipped to service our unique geography and topography," stated Senator Bolques. The allocation of funds for the two Type-3 pumper fire trucks has proven to be a game-changer for the VIFEMS, enabling them to respond rapidly and effectively to emergencies in St. John. The recent fire incident in Enighed is a testament to this investment's tangible impact, as firefighters were able to access the scene swiftly and prevent the spread of the fire.
