FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

Class A THE CHERTSEY SHOW TOP TRAY – SPONSORED BY THE TOBBLEY CABIN

1. The Top Tray Class is for a collection of three types of vegetables taken from the following list of 15, quantities in brackets: Carrots (3), cauliflowers (2), onions (3), parsnips (3), peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6 pods), tomatoes (6). French beans (6), Sweetcorn (2), Peppers (3), Cucumbers (2), Courgettes (3), Red Beet (3), Aubergines (2)
Carrots & parsnips to have stalks trimmed to 75mm. Peas & beans to have some stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces.
2. A black tray, measuring 45x60cm will be provided for your display.
3. Parsley only is allowed for garnishing. No accessories or other foliage allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.
