Born on 17 March 1923, he enlisted in the RAFVR in 1941 and was sent to the USA for pilot training. Here he was retained as an instructor on the North American AT-6 Harvard, at Napier Field, until spring 1943 (with a commission as P/O on 20 May 1942). He returned to the UK one year later with a promotion to F/O. Serving at 5(P) AFU, flying Masters, he was despatched to 55 OTU in August 1943, being retained again as an instructor. In January 1944 he joined 53 OTU, but February 1944 saw him finally given an operational posting, to 610 (County of Chester) Squadron, which was then in the process of converting from the Spitfire Mk V to the Spitfire Mk XIV. Patrick Bangerter stayed with 610 (County of Chester) Squadron until the unit was disbanded on 3 March 1945, and was then posted, as a Flight Commander, to 350 (Belgian) Squadron, where he remained until 15 June 1945. He was then posted to 41 Squadron until 10 September 1945, being posted to Flying Control at Lübeck, and was released from the RAF in November 1945. He died on 8 October 1999 at his home in Kenley, Surrey.
