Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose, and abuse.

Pharmaceutical drugs can be just as dangerous as street drugs when taken without a prescription or a doctor's supervision.

The non-medical use of prescription drugs ranks second only to marijuana as the most common form of drug abuse in America.

The majority of teenagers abusing prescription drugs get them from family and friends—and the home medicine cabinet.

Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold. Unused drugs that are flushed contaminate the water supply. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.

Take-back programs are the best way to dispose of old drugs. But if a program is not available:

- Take the meds out of their bottles;
- Mix them with something unappealing like used kitty litter or coffee grounds;
- Seal them in a bag or disposable container, and throw that away.

Food Assistance (SUNCAP): Food Assistance for SSI Recipients

The SUNCAP Program is a special Food Assistance Program for individuals who receive **Supplemental Security Income (SSI).**

You may be eligible to receive food assistance benefits through the SUNCAP Program without any additional application, paperwork, or interviews. If you already receive food assistance benefits in the regular Food Assistance Program, you may be automatically put in the SUNCAP Program when you become SSI eligible. If your food assistance benefits will go down because of SUNCAP, you may choose to continue receiving your food assistance benefits under the regular Food Assistance Program.

BREVARD COUNTY RESIDENTS Financially Impacted By Covid

Brevard County has \$18 M for housing funding to help those financially affected by the COVID-19 pandemic (**Indirectly or directly affected- all self reported**). This assistance is for rent/rental arrears, utilities and home energy costs/costs arrears, other expenses related to housing, and burial.

<u>CHANGES</u>: The income limit is more generous than past funding and there is no case management component. The county has been trying to make this process less challenging to be able to help more people and get the available resources out to people who need it.

Assistance Key Points:

- Applicants do not need to be literally homeless.
- Funds may be used for delinquent rent, as well as up to 3 months of prospective rent.
- Applicants can 're-certify' their eligibility with a (not-yet-created shortened application) at the end of the 3 months of prospective rent and may be able to get another 3 months of prospective rent.
- <u>This funding will also pay for hotels</u> if hotel agrees to 30 days of stay.
- Applicants may be self-pay at hotel/motel and, as long as the hotel/motel will 'bill out' a month in advance.
- Room rentals in doubled-up situations may also apply as long as there is a lease.

Application Key Points:

- Income verification is a 1040 from 2020 tax year.
- A FULL COPY of a valid lease in the name of the applicant is required.
- Require W-9 from Landlord If you are having issues with obtaining this, please call 321-633-2007 to find out what you can do. (*It has been "said" that the landlord can provide phone number for them to call to get this information from he/she directly,* **BUT call to verify**)
- ALL documentation must be provided at time of submission for the application to be considered, or application will be denied.
- Full process takes about 4 weeks.





WHAT IS IT AND HOW IS IT DIFFERENT FROM A VACCINE?

A vaccine helps stimulate and prepare your <u>immune</u> <u>system</u> to respond if or when you are exposed to the virus. Monoclonal antibodies boost the immune system after you are already sick, speeding up your immune response to prevent COVID-19 from getting worse. Monoclonal Antibody Treatments (MAB) for COVID-19 can prevent severe illness, hospitalization and death among high-risk individuals. This treatment is available widely in Florida.

Individuals 12 years and older who are high-risk, that have contracted or been exposed to COVID-19, are eligible for this treatment. Treatment is free and vaccination status does not matter.

HOW DO THEY WORK?

Monoclonal antibodies are like the antibodies your body makes to fight viruses and other bugs, but they are made in the labs of pharmaceutical companies, and they're designed to target the <u>coronavirus</u> spike protein. When the antibodies bind to the spike protein, they block the virus from entering your body's cells. If the virus can't enter cells, it can't make copies of itself and continue spreading within the body.

If a person is already sick, that means monoclonal antibodies prevent them from having severe symptoms that require hospitalization. If someone has been exposed, monoclonal antibodies can fend off the virus to prevent them from becoming sick in the first place. You can think of monoclonal antibodies as guided missiles that target and neutralize the virus, but they don't stick around. While monoclonal antibodies are effective for about a month, they are long gone 6 months later, when a <u>vaccine</u> still offers significant protection.

WHEN SHOULD YOU GET THEM?

Timing is critical with monoclonal antibodies. The earlier they are given, the more effective they are at treating or preventing COVID-19. They are really most effective within the first 4 to 5 days of symptoms. Monoclonal antibodies can't be given after 10 days of symptoms.

It's important to get tested as soon as you notice any possible symptoms, and as soon as you test positive, get in touch with your doctor about your interest in monoclonal antibodies either for yourself or others you've been in contact with who are at high risk.

(EHEAP) Emergency Home Energy Assistance for the Elderly

Serves Elderly OR Persons who are living with at least one resident 60 or older

If you are living in a household with at least one resident who is age 60 or older, you may be eligible for energy bill payment assistance. Utility categories eligible for heating/cooling bill assistance include electricity, natural gas, wood, and propane. Utilities / Other Home Cost & Repair

Your EHEAP program may be able to offer you one or more of the following types of assistance:

- · Payments to disconnected, delinquent, or past due energy bills
- Deposits to connect or restore energy
- Late fees and disconnect/reconnect fees
- Purchasing blankets, portable fans, space heaters, and window air conditioners
- Repairing the existing heating/cooling unit
- Charges from a now-closed account previously held by the elder resident
- Payment to a landlord when utility costs are included in rent
- Temporary emergency shelter due to an energy-related crisis

Cremation / Burial Assistance

Brevard County through the Housing and Human Services Department provides funds for cremation assistance in accordance with Florida Statutes of an indigent person who has no relatives or resources that can assume this responsibility.

Who qualifies for the County Indigent Cremation Program?

• Any resident of Brevard County who does not have any relatives or resources to pay for funeral expenses.

• If there are no relatives or resources to pay for burial, household must be at or below 125% of poverty guidelines.

Can the person making the funeral arrangements come into the office with a signed contract? (from a Funeral Home)

No, they must first come into office to determine if the deceased is eligible before signing any contracts.

How would someone apply for the Cremation Program?

They must call one of our offices to schedule an appointment. Must bring to the appointment the picture identification for all adult household members, social security cards, bank statements for the past 2 months and verification of income for the past two months for all household members.

Cremation Assistance Facts:

.....

• The County will assist up to \$450 for cremation expenses, children and adults.

• No other cremation assistance program can be used with the county program. If assistance is being received from another agency you will not qualify for the County's program.

Funeral/Burial Assistance Facts:

• The total funeral expenses cannot exceed the amount of assistance the County is paying.

• You can pick any funeral home as long as the funeral home is willing to work with the County for payment. It generally takes 2 to 3 weeks for the Funeral Home to receive payment.

Emergency Housing Vouchers

You may be eligible for an Emergency Housing Voucher if you meet the following criteria:

- Homeless
- At risk of homeless
- Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking
- Recently homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having high risk of housing instability.

Child Restraints – Car Seats and Booster Seats



TEN TIPS FOR FIREARM SAFETY IN YOUR HOME

- > Always keep the firearm's muzzle pointed in a safe direction. A "safe direction" means that the gun is pointed so that even if an accidental discharge occurred, it would not result in injury.
- Always keep your finger off the trigger until you actually intend to shoot. When handling a gun, rest your finger outside the trigger guard or along the side of the gun. Don't touch the trigger until you are actually ready to fire.
- Firearms should be unloaded when not actually in use. Whenever you pick up a gun, such as when removing it from or returning it to storage, remember to point it in a safe direction and make sure it is unloaded.
- Be sure you know how your firearm operates: read the manual on your firearm, know how to safely open and close the action of the firearm and know how to safely remove any ammunition from the firearm and its magazine.
- Store your firearms in a locked cabinet, safe, gun vault or storage case when not in use, ensuring they are in a location inaccessible by children and cannot be handled by anyone without your permission.
- Store your ammunition in a locked location separate from firearms.
- Use a gun locking device that renders the firearm inoperable when not in use. Agun lock should be used as an additional safety precaution and not as a substitute for secure storage.
- Make sure young people in your home are aware of and understand the safety guidelines concerning firearms. Have them sign the Project ChildSafe Pledge for young people—a reminder that if they find an unattended firearm in their home or a neighbor's to not touch it, and tell an adult.
- Always unload, clean and place your firearms in their secure storage location immediately after returning from a hunting trip or a day at the range.
- Educate everyone in your family about firearms safety. Visit the Project ChildSafe website for safety information and to find out where to get a free firearm safety kit in your area.

Injunction for Protection:

An injunction is a court order against another person who has been physically violent with you and/or has placed you in fear of physical violence. The purpose is to require him or her to stay away from your home, your car, your place of employment, and other places the court finds necessary. Injunctions can order the other person not to contact you by phone, in writing, by email, or in person. Injunctions can include other relief that the court feels is appropriate.

The Victims Compensation program offers injured crime victims financial assistance for medical care, lost income, mental health services, funeral expenses and other out-of-pocket expenses directly related to the injury.

The school based dental sealant program provides free sealants to children, after parental consent, in Title 1 elementary schools in second and sixth grades. A sealant is a thin coating of plastic applied to the biting surface of molars to protect against cavitycausing bacteria. The treatment has been proven to be 86% effective in preventing tooth decay. Dental hygienists also provide dental education, assessment and referrals as needed.






