ETHNIC GENOCIDES IN ARDAMATA LOCALITY IN WEST DARFUR

A DETAILED REPORT ON WHAT TRANSPIRED
DURING THE ATTACK ON ARDMATA LOCALITY IN
NOVEMBER 2023.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The fight between the Sudanese Army (SAF) and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in South Darfur has intensified with trends similar to those in Khartoum where SAF uses the tactic of shelling in areas around their base without actually leaving the base. This is done on suspicion that RSF occupied residences of civilians neighboring the SAF base with the intention to attack.

Sudan is currently ravaged by war and human rights violations are happening on a large scale. In Darfur, the armed conflict took an ethnic turn between Arabs and non-Arabs. In this detailed report, ACJPS has documented yet another ethnically motivated attack in the Ardamata locality in West Darfur targeting the Massalite people. The attack launched by the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) and allied Arab militia led to the seizure of the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) base in Ardmata, killing more than 800 people including SAF soldiers and Massalite people, injuring several others and thousands displaced to fairly safer states within Sudan and the neighboring Chad. Additionally, women and girls were reportedly subjected to sexual violence in the camp and while fleeing the area.

Background

In 1919, an agreement was signed between the Massalite Kingdom and the French and British administrators. The first military base was established by the British in the Krinik locality in 1918 and later moved to the Ardamata locality neighboring Elgenina (the other side of Bari Valley). This base was later occupied by the Sudanese army.

Ardamata is an administrative locality situated northeast of Elgenina, the West Darfur capital. The locality hosts the headquarters of the Sudanese Army (15th division), Ardamata prison, and center 1 and 2 IDP camps that were established in 2004. Ardamata and Elgenina localities are separated by a valley known as the Bari Valley.

On 24 April 2023, SAF retreated and withdrew from Elgenina and returned to the 15th Division during a gun exchange with RSF.

Following the death of Gen. Khamis Abakar, the SPLM/SA Chairperson who also doubled as the West Darfur Governor, on 14 July 2023, the SPLM/SA withdrew from Elgenina and deployed their forces in three different locations in Ardamata, that is inside the SAF base, Ardamata IDP camp (which is predominately occupied by the Massalite) and Ardamata prison that was vacant after the prisoners escaped at the beginning of the armed conflict in April 2023.

Attacks in Ardamata locality

On 4 November 2023, the Sudanese army withdrew from their base in Ardamata for the first time in more than 100 years. At around 10:00 am, RSF seized the SAF base in Ardmata after four days of heavy gunfights between the warring parties. Other parties also joined in the gunfight. For example, the Sudanese Peoples Liberation Army/Sudanese Alliance and local volunteers joined SAF whilst the Arab militias joined RSF. At around 1:00 pm on the same day, several SAF officials including seven high-ranking officers withdrew from the base and went to other SAF bases in Serba and Kulubs whilst others crossed to the neighboring Chad (possibly through a deal with RSF because they went out through the East direction where RSF was heavily deployed).

A reliable source informed ACJPS that the director of the SAF Military Intelligence unit, Mr. Waleed Gism Alsaïd (a former NCP member and a nephew to Gen. Al-Burhan) refused to retreat and immediately took over the leadership of the troops. Another group of SAF soldiers remained at the base and on the battlefield with other allied forces fighting against RSF. They were resultantly killed, injured, and captured as prisoners of war.

Before this development, SAF had previously targeted at least five neighborhoods in Elgenina predominantly occupied by Arabs resulting in the killing of 15 residents and injuring 18 others including children. This is what allegedly prompted a revenge attack by RSF-supported allied militia like the Armed Arabs and Tama Support militias to launch heavy attacks

targeting the Ardmata neighborhood, particularly the Ardmata IDP camp where the SPLM/SA had settled after their withdrawal from Elgenina in the second week of July 2023 and residents from the Massalite tribe.

Approximately 870 people including soldiers lost their lives, several others were injured, and massive destruction and loss of property during the attacks and the displacement of people to Elgenina and Chad. The attacks were also characterized by different human rights violations like looting, enforced disappearance, and sexual violence against women and girls. Ms. Sharifah (Pseudo name), a 20-year-old survivor told ACJPS that she was raped by the attackers while fleeing from Ardamata to the Alshati neighborhood located North of Elgenina. “They threatened to kill my baby when I first resisted...,” she painfully added.

Reliable sources informed ACJPS that RSF captured approximately 500 people as prisoners of war and that at least 30 people from SAF were injured and transferred to Elgenina Hospital for medical attention.

Parties involved in the gunfight in Ardamata

During the gun exchange in Ardamata, SAF was led by the 15th division commander alongside the commander SAF Military Intelligence Unit whilst SPLM/SA was led by their military commander, Mr. Omer Burah Ali Suleiman also known as Habashi. The Massalite forces (created in March 2022 by the Massalite kingdom replacing the Massalite self-defense tribal forces) also participated in the fight.

The RSF on the other hand was led by Gen. Abdul Rahman Jumma, the commander of West Darfur, and Major Mohamed Aljadi, the RSF Military Intelligence Unit director whilst the Arab tribal Resistance Forces previously known as “self-defense” was led by Mr. Mohamed Ismail and his deputy Mr. Mohamed Jubara.

There was also involvement of an unidentified armed group riding on camels, horses, and motorcycles looting property during the gunfights.

Attacks on civilians by SAF

On 3 November 2023, SAF in the 15th division in Ardmata randomly started shelling targeting five neighborhoods in Elgenina. The incident resulted in the killing of 15 residents and injuring 18 others who are currently admitted in Elgenina Hospital and Bashair Clinic in Elgenina. Additionally, 55 houses were destroyed; 35 in Alnaseem, 6 in Alshati, 3 in Alengaz, 5 in Alwadi, and 5 in the Alsafa neighborhood. The areas targeted are predominately occupied by Arabs.

RSF attack on civilians in Ardamata

The majority of the people living in Ardmata are from the Massalite tribe, and most of them are families of SAF soldiers and IDPs. However, on 1 November 2023, the residents started fleeing to the Northern neighborhoods in Elgenina and Chad to avoid possible attacks.

Nonetheless, approximately 252 civilians lost their lives as a result of attacks by RSF and affiliated militias including Mr. Mohamed Arbab, a Massalite native administration leader. Although Mr. Mohammed's family issued a statement on 15 November accusing the SPLM/SA of killing him because he did not want the Massalite forces to participate in the fights, the allegations are baseless as he was killed during the gun exchange. The attackers reportedly sexually violated two Women/girls.

ACJPS documented a total of 384 civilians including seven women who sustained injuries from the attack. They are currently admitted to Elgenina Hospital receiving medical attention.

Violations perpetrated by Arab militia

On 5 November 2023, 27 men from the Massalite tribe were abducted by Arab Militias affiliated to RSF in Ardmata. The men were transferred to Undouin Primary School located in the Undouin neighborhood in Elgenina. They were demanded to pay a sum of 3,000,000 Sudanese Pounds each as ransom. With the intervention of the Arab tribal leaders, the men were released on 7 November 2023 without paying the said ransom.

Another group of 35 people from the Massalite tribe aged between 14 to 40 years were arrested in Ardmata by Arab Militias. The group was taken to Sebera Airport located in the North East of Elgenina however, the status of the detainees is unknown.

Status of SAF military bases in Darfur

On 26 October 2023, the second biggest SAF base was seized by RSF following SAF withdrawal under the command of Major General Hussein Jadate. Later, on 1 November 2023, Gen. Jadate was seen at Wad Sayedna Military Hospital in Omdurman when Gen. Abdul Fatah Al-Burhan, the SAF high command visited him.

On 31 October 2023, RSF seized the SAF Military base in Zalingi, Central Darfur. On 3 November 2023, two SAF bases in Nitrite and Golo were seized by SPLM/Abdul Wahid Noor.

On 19 November 2023, RSF announced that they had arrested Colonel Mohamed Ibrahim (a SAF official) from Central Africa Republic (CAR) where he and his troops had fled. Col. Ibrahim was the commander of the SAF base in Alradoun, South Darfur bordering CAR.

Role of the Massalite Kingdom

The Massalite Native Administration head also known as Sultan, Mr. Saad Bahar Eldien Abdul Rahman fled to Chad in April 2023 shortly before his house was raided by armed Arab members, some of whom were well-known residents of the Aljabal neighborhood in Elgenina on 28 April 2023. The raiders accused the Sultan of participating in the armed conflict using the Massalite Kingdom Forces previously known as Self Defense (MSD) Forces and allying with SPLM/SA and SAF. The raid resulted in the death of Mohamed Saad and his brother, Tariq Bahar Eldien (the Sultan's children), the female family members were threatened and assaulted, and property looted including seven vehicles and gold jewelry. Mr. Assad Bahar Eldien, the Sultan's younger brother, and his nephew, Yasir Yahiya were arrested at 8:00 am and 6:00 pm respectively on the same day. The two were detained at an unknown location in Undouin the neighborhood.

Other developments in July 2023

On 17 July 2023, SAF came up with an initiative aimed at restoring the situation in the state. On 18 July 2023, both Arab and Masalite tribes represented by their leaders signed a ceasefire agreement in Elgenina. The Arab tribe was represented by Mr. Masar Mohamed Asil and the Massalite was represented by Mr. Salih Arbab.

Following the signing of the ceasefire agreement between Massalite and Arab tribes, residents volunteered to remove corpses from the streets in Elgenina and accorded them a decent burial. This also applied to the corpses of Massalite people in the neighborhoods of Aljabal, Aljmarik, Althura, and Altdamoun and the Arab victims in Alsafa, Alnaseem, Alengaz, Alshati, Undouin and Aljabal neighborhoods.

Attempted assassination of the acting Governor

On 22 July 2023, the community leaders issued a statement and announced the appointment of the Deputy Governor Mr. Eltijani Kashoum as acting Governor after the demise of Gen. Khamis.

On 18 November 2023, Mr. Karshoum survived an assassination attempt while in Ardmata. This prompted him to transfer his office from Ardmata to Asnar Alsuna mosque temporarily. According to a reliable source, the attacker was captured by Mr. Karshoum's guards but the details about the incident have been concealed.

Mass graves

There is a grave in the Shikri Anga locality where several SPLM/SA were buried. The fighters were involved in a gunfight with the resident of Shukri Anga whilst attempting to flee to Chad after the death of Gen. Khamis. This resulted in the death of thousands of the fighters who were then buried in a mass grave.

Another mass grave was discovered in Dersia and Alaradiba in West Darfur where several Arab victims were buried.

There is a third Mass grave near a bus station in Elgenina where victims of the 24 April 2023 attacks were buried. Several people lost their lives as a result of the gunfights between SAF, RSF, and affiliated militia when SAF launched an attack on the Alnaseem neighborhood.

The fourth mass grave is located next to Aljeel primary school in Elgenina where 45 victims of a clash between RSF supported by Arab militia against SAF and SPLM/SA were buried. However, ACJPS was unable to verify whether the victims were civilians or from the warring parties.

ACJPS discovered another mass grave at Kaga Valley in a place called Faki Narga.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1) The **RSF** and **SAF** should:

1. Uphold the rights of civilians, including their right to life.
2. Engage in peaceful dialogue to find a lasting and peaceful solution to the conflict.
3. Prioritize the well-being of the people of Sudan.
4. End the use of sexual violence as a weapon of war.
5. Take responsibility for any actions that have resulted in harm to civilians or other parties involved in the conflict.
6. Cooperate with regional partners to find a lasting solution to the conflict. This is essential to ending the violence and ensuring peace for the people of Sudan.
7. Allow safe access to humanitarian services for displaced people.

2) Sudanese Authorities should:

1. Carry out an independent and impartial investigation into the cases of extrajudicial killings, arbitrary arrests detention, and sexual violations and hold perpetrators accountable.
2. Provide free rehabilitation services and compensation to victims.
3. Uphold Sudan's international obligations under relevant regional and international treaties which Sudan ratified by immediately carrying out independent, transparent, and effective investigations to determine the fate and whereabouts of all missing persons since 15 April 2023. Where victims are in the custody of the state (SAF), they should be either unconditionally released or charged before the courts of law. For those who have died, graves must be shown to families/relatives, and bodies released for proper burial. Perpetrators must be held to account through fair trials.
4. Provide humanitarian services to people fleeing the war.

3) The **international community** should:

1. Prioritize the protection of civilians and the security situation in Sudan
2. The United Nations Human Rights Council must prioritize the pursuit of justice for the victims of the Sudan War.
3. The UN Security Council should refer the situation in Sudan to the International Criminal Court (ICC) and support the court's efforts to investigate and prosecute perpetrators.
4. Deploy resources to ensure the protection of civilians in Sudan and assist with independent and impartial investigations of human rights violations to ensure accountability.
5. Provide humanitarian assistance to civilians who are feeling the war.
