The Bike Trip Experience

My experience with the bike trip this past summer was interesting. The trip happened to be my very first time camping. I had never given a thought to sleeping outdoors, especially since I am a city boy at heart. So, after the bike trip it was funny that I found myself at Walmart looking at camping equipment and finding that it is relatively inexpensive. I was pleasantly surprised that a 2-person tent costs only a little over \$30 and a bed pump about \$6.

On the first day of the trip I did not know what to expect. The only thing I knew was that I was asked to take photos because of my experience in photography and media over the past 15 years. This was the only familiar activity that I would be doing during the entire trip. In addition, I would help Joaquin Gonzales write instructions/directions on the road with chalk. Without any camping experience, setting up a tent each night was also new to me. Honestly, I found that it was not that difficult. My prior knowledge consisted of watching films that showed a couple of people struggling to set up a tent, as they tried to figure out how all of the metal pieces fit together. My tent was actually relatively simple compared to other people on the trip who had more elaborate ones to put together each night.

The first night was very uncomfortable as I listened to coyotes howl in the distance and other noises coming from the fields. The next morning I was told that I could download a "whitenoice" app and thankfully this helped me sleep through the next 4 nights.

The second night I slept great because I was so tired from lack of sleep the previous night. Sleeping was not a problem anymore, but a new problem arose. I felt I was not connecting with many people. I wanted to leave and told Jarod Brey that I felt I was wearing out my welcome. I have always struggled with getting to know new people and sometimes I can be a very difficult person to deal with. After a discussion with Jarod I decided to stay, even though I would rather have gone back home.

Once I made this decision, events started to come into their proper perspectives. I was having fun not only taking photos, but also getting to know a small portion of the church family. Each day became a blessing and it continued to get better. My anxiety was not as bad as it had been the first two days and I started feeling more comfortable. We did not have cell phone service and this gave me an opportunity to get away from technology for a while. I was relaxing more and actually talking directly with people as it was intended to be, not through a messenger app or social media. It was so refreshing for six days to be out in the woods and on the road.

During the trip, I shared my story about water tubing. I actually got up and spoke in front of all of the bike trip participants, a first for me. Honestly my story entailed somewhat of a bad experience for me and I felt I needed to share it. I was asked to complete a video compilation from 700 photos that I took during the trip. We returned on a Saturday and the presentation needed to be completed for the next day to be shown during the service at Main St. Baptist Church. It was hard to think about going home on the last day because I had so many different and new experiences, some good and some unpleasant.

However, I can say for a fact that given the opportunity, I would definitely participate in another bike trip. But first, we've got to get through another cold, bleak winter season. Now I know why Kurtis Wilson was so excited to be on the bike trip. The bike trip in his words: "It's like Christmas to me!" Believe me, that is not so far from the truth.

What I have learned on this trip is that I am not worthless in the eyes of God. When people do not find worth in me, I do not need to worry about that. God sees my worth and that is all I need.
