#### MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

- 1. South Paulding High School will host the Spartan Battalion Raider Challenge on Saturday, 07 October 2023, at South Paulding High School, 1364 Winn Road, Douglasville, GA 30134.
- 2. We have limited this meet to forty teams (4-5 teams broken into ten groups (school integrity maintained). Schools can enter a maximum of three teams with no more than one team per category in the Male, Female and Mixed team categories. If open slots remain a week prior to the meet, schools may add a second team in a specific category, but that team is not eligible for streamers/trophies.
- 3. This meet will be the second Area VII Qualifier for the state Raider Championship. Area VII schools must let me know their team categories prior to 19 Aug. Priority of slots will go to Area VII schools.
- 4. Entry Fees: \$100.00 for the first and second team registered. \$125 for a third team. Slots are only reserved when payment is made. Mail in advance is the preferred method but payment on the day of the event will be accepted by cash or check. Checks need to be made out to: South Paulding High School. Registration form is attached. Please send as soon as possible via email to <a href="mailto:rnewbill@paulding.k12.ga.us">rnewbill@paulding.k12.ga.us</a>.
- 5. The coaches only meeting will take place on Saturday at 0800 in the JROTC classroom. No Cadets are allowed in this meeting. Competition will begin at 0845. The awards ceremony will be held on the football field shortly after the conclusion of the competition.
- 6. Streamers for Guidons will be given to the top three in each event, for each team category. Trophies and streamers will be given to the top three overall teams in the Male, Mixed and Female Team categories.
- 7. Team coaches are required to submit a memorandum with team members listed, stating all required forms for participation are completed and team members meet eligibility requirements to participate. Coaches will maintain all forms and only turn in the memorandum.
- 8. Latrines are located at the football stadium under the bleachers on the visitor (east) side (see map).
- 9. The fenced in grass area on the north side of the football field (band tower location) is off limits. Instructors, please ensure your Cadets and parents are aware of this. Locations for teams to set up tailgating "Base Camps" will be first come, first served per the map provided. Only these designated areas may be used for team Base Camps. Please ensure you maintain fifteen feet between teams and be considerate of noise, space, etc.

- 10. In the event of rain, all events will continue as planned. If severe weather happens during the event, all personnel will move to the designated holding area in the school gym. South Paulding instructors and cadets will guide all personnel through the JROTC classroom to the gym. A weather call will be made at 06 1200 OCT 2023. In the event of a significant weather conflict, the event will be cancelled, and participants will be notified via email and via the Spartan Battalion Website: <a href="https://www.sphsjrotc.weebly.com">www.sphsjrotc.weebly.com</a>.
- 11. Park in designated areas only. Busses will be parked in an area designated in the rear parking lot. Please look for guides when you arrive.
- 12. Instructors, please bring a stopwatch for backup timing of events. We will need instructor assistance for grading to make this meet happen.
- 13. Participating Cadets will wear wrist bands provided in the team packets.

- 15. Specific instructions:
  - a. All coaches will receive a packet at the coaches meeting with the sequence of events, wrist bands for each team member, and score sheets.
  - b. All teams will compete with 35lb rucks during the Combat Casualty Rescue.
  - c. Each team will consist of twelve members with 10 Cadets competing in each event. Competing cadets will be allowed to compete on one team only; meaning a cadet on the male team cannot be a substitute for a cadet on the mixed team.
  - d. Mixed teams must have a minimum of four females competing in each event and can have up to nine females competing.
  - e. This meet will be conducted in a Round Robin format. Raider Teams will be broken down into groups of 4-5 teams and must remain with these groups for each event. Teams are not authorized to "float" from event to event. Groups will rotate to the next event once all events have reported they have completed that iteration. Teams who report to an event prior to their groups designated start time may do so BUT THEY WILL BE BUMPED if a team with the current scheduled time arrives for the event. Simply put, do not let your team get ahead and do not let your team be late when we rotate.
  - f. Only the Raider team members will be allowed to be on the courses. Coaches, parents, or spectators must observe the events from behind the roped off area or a safe distance without interfering with competitors. Coaches and parents are not allowed to coach teams once the event has started. Any coaching during the event will result in that team being disqualified from that event.
  - g. If a team suffers injuries which lowers the number of competitors below 10 Cadets who are physically unable to participate, one addition member can be added to the team after the Team Coach coordinates with the Event Organizer, MAJ Newbill. If this happens, that team will compete only for training and will not be eligible for awards in those events and overall trophies.

- h. Judges will brief teams quickly before each event so ensure your team understands the event prior to arriving. Penalties will be clearly defined. After each event, the team commander will go to the judge for the time and notification of any penalties assessed. Team Commanders will sign all score cards. Once the score card is signed, no protest may be submitted. Judges will inform Team Commanders if there is a penalty and decide it on site. Coaches will PROFESSIONALLY address all issues with the Judge. Please do not argue with the Judge. If a coach, Cadet, or spectator/parent is arguing with the Judge, the team will be disqualified from the entire meet and must depart South Paulding High School immediately. Only after attempting to resolve the problem with the Judge, the coach can address the issue concerns with the Event Organizer (MAJ Newbill). I will not overturn a judgement call unless there is indisputable evidence to do so. In short, I will not overrule a judge's decision UNLESS it is in violation of the established rules. Hearsay evidence will not be considered.
- i. If a team member is injured during an event and cannot finish, the team will be disqualified from only that event. The team must leave one member with the injured Cadet and continue along the course and inform the judge of the injured Cadet. The event judge will notify the Event Organizer for medical assistance.
- j. If a team or school decide not to compete in any event, please inform the Head Judge for that event and the scoring room to help us maintain an accurate record of throughput.
- k. Unsportsmanlike conduct, such as profanity, will be subject to a 1-minute penalty each time a team member, coach or spectator with affiliation to the competing team acts in a way that is does not comply with our creed. Judges may disqualify a team for unsportsmanlike conduct, to include actions of team coaches and spectators. Coaches, please ensure your parents know their behavior could impact their team's overall score. If incidents occur, offenders will be instructed to depart the school property or be escorted out by law enforcement. If the offender fails to comply or if law enforcement is called, that schools' team will be disqualified from the event and become ineligible for overall placement.
- I. Do not drop any equipment before, during, or after each event. Dropping equipment before, during or after an event can result in a 1-minute penalty. This is to help preserve the equipment. Dropping of equipment is defined as uncontrolled contact with the ground from above the top of Cadet boots.
- 16. The Spartan Battalion Raider Challenge will consist of five events that are designed with minimal chance for penalty. Raider Team groups will rotate to each event together.
  - a. Team Relay: Team members will run individually ¼ mile (1 lap around the track) while wearing a 25-pound running vest. Each team will be provided two running vests. Only the Cadet running their lap and the next Cadet running will be allowed on the track. Transition of vest will take place off the track. At the completion of the event. Up to four teams may run at the same time. Cadets waiting to run will remain in designated areas and Cadets who have completed the run will move to a designated area once the vest is removed. At the designated transition point, the next runner will be standing by with vest already on and receive a baton from the runner before them and then run one lap. Teams will continue this until all team members have completed their run. Faster runners will pass to the outside of slower

runners. The clock will stop when the 10th member of the team crosses the finish line. Cadets will not be disqualified if they run in boots, but it is highly discouraged. No Cadets will be allowed to run along-side the ten-member team competing. The uniform for this event will be team T-shirt or tan/brown T-shirt, running shoes, and ACU/OCP trousers. All team members must be in the same shirt. No shorts for this event.

- b. Raider Fitness Test: The team run consist of 10 members running as team along a ~400-yard course. Teams will start and run 15-yards and conduct a 20-foot low crawl. If cadets hit the low crawl device (PVC pipe) and it comes apart, a 1-minute penalty will be administered (tell your teams be in control entering and exiting the low crawl). The team will continue 20-yards until they reach equipment pick-up point consisting of 5-Water Cans, 10-Ammo Cans, 4-kettlebells, 1-two man carry equipment box and a 2-man carry litter. Cadets will carry this equipment 30-35 yards and set it down. All equipment must be at the drop point before the first Cadet can start the tire high steeper. Cadets will then run 10-yards to the tire high stepper drill. All team members must hit every tire. There is no penalty for falling, just make sure you hit every tire. Continue to the turnaround point and secure five 35-lbs rucks and continue to the Speed Agility Maze (zigzag). After exiting the Maze, teams will continue to the Canoe Carry. All five rucks will be placed in the canoe for (male and mix teams only) and all 10 members will secure the canoe and carry it to the halfway turn-around point (near the start line), circle around the cone and repeat the course in reverse. Female teams will place the 5 rucks by the canoe and only carry the canoe to the halfway turn-around point. The Canoe will be sitting on blocks of wood, and it must be placed back on these blocks before the rucks can be removed from the canoe. A 30-second penalty will be enforced every time the canoe touches the ground. Teams will continue through all events and reset the course. On the return trip, all water cans, ammo cans and kettlebells must be in the upright position before the time stops. Time will stop when the last member of the team crosses the finish line, and all equipment is in the upright position. If a team member must return to set up a piece of equipment to the upright position, that member must negotiate all obstacles enroute and returning. The uniform for this event is the team T-shirt or tan/brown T-shirt, boots, ACU/OCP. All team members must be in the same shirt.
- c. Cross County Rescue: Each Raider Team will field 10 members to participate in the CCR. The course is approximately 1-mile with uneven terrain consisting of grass, dirt, downed trees, rocks, hilly terrain and obstacles (8-ft wall, Hurdles). Teams will be briefed on the course layout by the Head Judge when they arrive for their rotation. Teams will be instructed to rescue a casualty in the shortest time possible with all equipment returned. All team members must finish within 10-meters of each other. The uniform for this event is the team T-shirt or tan/brown T-shirt, boots, ACU/OCP trousers. All team members must be in the same shirt.
  - i. A stretcher with a container will simulate the casualty and five rucksacks will be provided at the start point. The rucksacks will weigh approximately thirty-five pounds for all teams and the litter will weigh 125 pounds for Male and mixed teams, one hundred pounds for female teams.
  - ii. The stretcher may not touch the ground from start to finish except at designated points at the 8-ft wall. All rucks and Cadets will go over the 8-ft wall. All Cadets, rucks and litter will go over the hurdles. Cadets must stay together as a team and not move to the next obstacle until all 10 Cadets have completed the obstacle (8-ft wall, hurdles). If the stretcher touches the

ground, it is a 1-minute penalty per incident. If it is dropped, to include after the team crosses the finish line, a 1-minute penalty will be administered against that team.

- iii. Upon all 10 Cadets completing the hurdles, Cadets may run forward and PLACE rucks at a designated cache point prior to the 10-meter line and return to assist with the litter. If rucks are left at the cache point, one Cadet from that team must stay with the ruck to ensure teams do not mix equipment.
- iv. Dropping of the litter or rucksacks is defined as an "uncontrolled placement" of the litter/ruck on the ground from above the top of the boots based on what the judges witness. This rule is meant to help protect the equipment.
- d. One Rope Bridge: This event will consist of ten cadets. The Standard One Rope Bridge will be in accordance with FM 3-97.61, TC 90-6-1 (Military Mountaineering-2102) and all guidance from HQ 6th Brigade JROTC State Raider Challenge Competition MOI (29 July 2113). Rope length will be at least 121 feet. No more than three Cadets can be snapped onto the rope at one time. Uniform will be ACU with boots. Teams must provide their own equipment for the construction and crossing of the rope bridge. Judges will not have time to teach teams the correct way to build a rope bridge. Teams will be given a five-minute preparation window which will be utilized to tie Swiss/Aussie seats and back coil the rope in a duffle bag. The Judge WILL NOT inspect Aussie and Swiss seats. Team coaches (not team commanders) will inspect their teams Aussie/Swiss seats and inform the Judge all Cadets are properly tied and ready. The Judge will only ensure the snap links are properly secured to each Cadet with a Swiss seat who will be crossing the rope bridge. The rope will be back laid in a duffle bag IAW the 6th Brigade SOP (see para 4.c. of this MOI). Duffle bags will be available for use if you do not have one. Below is basic guidance for common methods for constructing a rope bridge. The uniform for this event is the team T-shirt or tan T-shirt, boots, and ACU/OCP trousers. Cadets may use open finger gloves for this event since they will be using home school equipment. All team members must be in the same shirt.
  - i. Distance between poles is ~45 feet. Dead space will begin six feet from both anchor points and will be clearly marked. Teams will only have one attempt. No redo's.
  - ii. If a Cadet's back touches the ground while crossing, they will not be penalized. If their feet or hands touch the ground they will be penalized only if used to assist the Raider across the rope bridge.
  - iii. The rope must be back laid into a duffle bag IAW the 6th BDE guidance from the 2118 6th Brigade Raider SOP. Only one end of the rope may stick out over the side of the opening as long as the rope does not touch the ground. The Far-Side Raider ties an end of the line bowline w/overhand knot or figure 8 and snaps in before crossing into the (dead zone) and is belayed across the dead zone (no figure 8 across the body). Belaying means someone is controlling the rope in both hands and watching the raider cross.
  - iv. When the Far-Side Raider reaches the far-side, he/she moves to the anchor point, detaches the snap-link from the harness, wraps the bridge rope around the anchor 180 degrees and "temporarily" secures it by closing the

snap-link on the bridge rope. NOTE: The far-side raider does not have to "temporarily" snap in if they immediately tie the far-side knot.

- v. Near-side construction: A wireman's knot or figure 8 slip knot on a bite are the only Transport Tightening Systems authorized. The team has the option of using two snap links with opposing gates or one steel locking snap link. If using one snap link for the Transport Tightening System, it must be locked. The judge will simply attempt to open the gate to ensure the snap link is locked. If the gate opens completely, it will be a DQ. If using two snap links, and the gates are not opposing, it will be a DQ. A wooden, metal, plastic stick/implement or two snap links can be used to aid in the disassembly of the knots. The stick/implement or snap-links may not be used as a speed tightener. NOTE: The Near-side commander may begin constructing the transport upon the word go but the Far-side Commander must be belayed while crossing the dead zone.
- vi. Once the transport knot is complete it must be connected back to the bridge rope with two snap-links or single steel locking snap link. When it is connected, the snap-links must have opposite gate openings as per the diagram. Snap-links cannot be used as speed tighteners.

- vii. The far-side must be secured with two round turns and two half hitches with or without a quick release OR a tensionless anchor knot with a minimum of four wraps around far-side anchor.
- viii. The transport tightening system is secured to the near-side anchor using two round turns and two (2) half hitches with or without a quick release. Either way it must have a 4-inch pig tail. The half hitches do not have to pass around all ropes between the anchor point and the wireman's knot or figure 8 on a bite.
- ix. Near Side Raider disassembles the transport system on the near side. He/she can tie a bowline w/overhand in the end of the bridge rope OR use the existing Wireman's or Figure 8 loop and secures the snap-link on his/her waist harness. The Near Side Raider is then belayed across the obstacle by Raiders on the far-side.
- x. As long as the Raider belaying has two hands on the rope and is looking at the near and far side Raider crossing the dead zone, no penalties will be assessed.
- xi. Refer to Rope Bridge Score sheet for additional guidance.

e. "Old School" Tire Flip: Each Raider Team will field ten members to participate in the Tire Flip. The tire will be positioned on the start/finish line between two cones. When instructed to begin, the team will begin to flip the tire 50-yards and around the designated turn-around point and return to the start line. Cadets may organize the team as they wish but you must have a minimum of three Cadets on the tire for all flips. The turn-around point will be a single cone, in which the team must flip the tire around to return to the start/finish line. If the tire touches a boundary cone or turnaround point cone, a 30-second penalty will be assessed for each violation. At the finish line, the tire must be completely flipped past the start/finish line between the two cones designating the Start/Finish line. The time will stop when the tire contacts the ground completely past the start line BETWEEN the Start/Finish line cones. The tire must be stay between the designated left and right boundaries which the tire may not touch. To prevent an injury caused by the tire coming down on a lower leg or foot, no Cadet can be ahead of the "pivot point" once the team begins each lift. The pivot point is defined as the point of the tire contacting the ground once a team begins the lift of the tire for each flip. At no time, can the tire be rolled, pushed or dragged along the course once the Judge begins the event until the team is complete. Refer to the Tire Flip Score sheet for additional guidance. The uniform for this event is the team T-shirt, boots and ACU/OCP trousers. All team members must be in the same shirt.






