
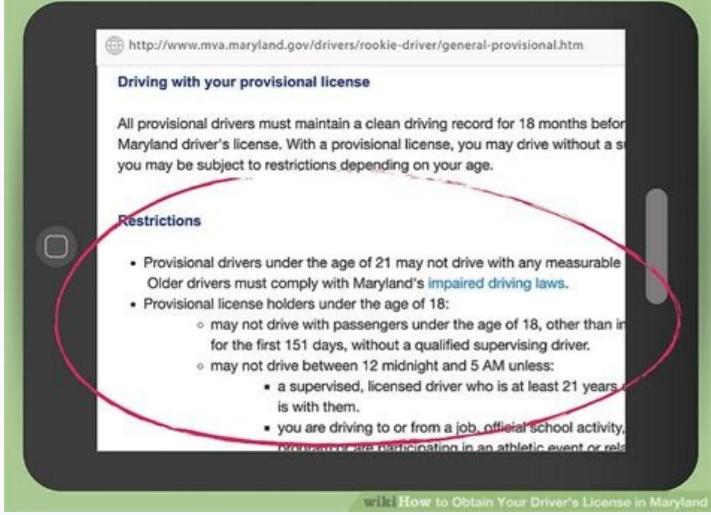

The adult must have held a driving license for at least 3 years and be seated next to the driver. Minors can handle passengers under the age of 18 if they are related to a minor. This means they are a spouse, sibling or other family member living in the same house. If a juvenile driver is charged with another offense, the police can penalize them for that offense.
