There are often discussions on document processing, document proposals, a summary of documents and a number of documents that often overlap. The documentary design is a set of elements that describe in detail the entire scope of your documentary project - a summary of the story, plot, processing, CV crew, budget and distribution plan. Potential donors usually apply for your proposal. Consider a package with suggestions for your movie business plan. Documentary processing - processing is almost like a scenario, describing in detail the scenes, characters and structure of the storyline. It is a proof of continuous and organic development, adapting to the development of history. This document sometimes requires large financial agencies. (Note: Write a script for a documentary is very difficult in the early stages of documentary creation due to the developmental nature of most documents, if not impossible!) The synopsis of the document - the synopsis is a brief overview tell. The length of summary can range from 1 to 3 three - page paragraphs! DOC Logline is a 1-2 frequency summary of your film that provides a central point/conflict/story of your narrative and usually provides an emotional overview of this story. These notes describing the film you watch on Netflix are lines! Document description - Description is shorter than the logo line. It is a quick and catchy designation used by marketers and distributors to promote and sell a film. The slogan often appears on film posters, DVD packaging, film catalogs, ads or television guides (above or under the title of the film). Tips for writing work/design/summary: Use an active voice (don't say "Maybe we're doing this movie", say "This movie is ..."). Let the reader believe that this film exists. Write in color - avoid general descriptions as "unique" or "magic". Explain why something is magical or unique. Be specific. Not only does it provide a general review of you. Describe situations, people and characters with live details to revive the story. Effective documentary: tells a great story through the story and visual description, captures the personal and human element of the story, attracts, inspires and leaves the reader that "this story needs to be told". The idea of processing or proposal is to have a written document in detail describing the proposal of a document that may bepotential investors, participants or sponsors.

Due to the genre of our short film being a 70's slasher horror, aspects of our film will include themes such as death, victims, killer, gore and tragedy. These will all be represented in the frameworks through camera, editing and sound techniques. The setting or location for our production will stay true to the typical conventions, as we plan to film in a house but may possibly venture outside into a woods or even a graveyard if it's suitable for added drama as our film develops. In our initial report we have identified some issues with filming specific locations such as filming in low-key lighting, however we have proposed some ways to tackle these problems such as light sources so everything will maintain a sense of professionalism. As we plan to stick to conventions during our film production, so will the choice in our characters. During our research we found the most common characters featured in a horror film are teenagers, couples and female adults. Furthermore in our audience research questionnaire, it stated how teenagers were the most appealing characters to watch in a horror film, so we have concluded of this research that teenagers will feature in our film. Beyond that will we still follow convention by having characters such as the killer and the victims clearly labeled and identifiable. Costume plays a significant role in our film as it helps to visually represent both the killer and victims with positive or negative connotations. With this in mind, we have decided that our killer will dress in black to carry negative connotations of death and gloom, whereas our victims may wear white to suggest their innocence and vulnerability. We are still in the process of deciding whether or not to go as far as adding a mask of possibly even make-up to our killer to further dehumanize him and appear more monstrous. This idea has come from my film research of the iconic slashers such as Michael Myers, Freddy Krueger, Jason Voorhees and Leatherface, all of which have distinctive features which the demographic instantly recognize.

In our film production we plan to incorporate many aspects of sound techniques including diegetic and non-diegetic sounds, sound bridge, sound effects and theme song. All of these factors help contribute to the typical conventions of a film, whilst adding an ambience to the film, being suitable to create an eerie feeling and creepy atmosphere which the target audience will pick up on.

It is the first step in the process of creating a cinematic vision. Expect your design and workmanship to be continually updated as the project progresses. The pitch/draft is not only a great tool for the director to brainstorm and explore potential themes and story angles, but also a great document to share with collaborators and potential sponsors. The length of the draft document can vary from 2 to 25 pages (or more) depending on the size of the project. The information you provide in your offer is true, and rightly so. If you're writing without a specific recipient, a 10 page document is a good length for documentary treatment. If you're writing a review for someone in particular—a reader at a production company, for example—screenwriter John August suggests asking him what he's looking for. Readers sometimes mean a certain number of pages. There are no specific rules for saying this. For James Cameron it is known for writing epic 70 -page film instructions. Its processing of the Terminator is worth reading ... If you have time to kill. What belongs to the documentary processing? When you format the documentary processing, you must write it as a tense and current story. It should have important story points and give the taste you want, but should not be overly stylized as a novel. For example, this is a complete story, so it is good to remove uncritical subset. You should focus on something that outlines your basic three -act structure, but without a script format. Stay faithful to the main story and characters. Treatment Summary

Theme: Slasher horror, death, killer and revenge etc. gathered inspiration from old slasher horrors such as ones from the 70s.

Setting: Set inside a house and outside of the house where the characters go missing one by one. Most chase scenes will all be taken inside of the house.

Characters: 3 boys, 3 girl teenage characters. One of the male characters will eventually be named as the killer.

Costume: Killer dressed in black with hood and mask. Costume for teenagers just average everyday clothes. Make-up used during killings such as fake blood and gory injuries. Also we will have typical murder weapons such as knives being used.

Sound: A lot of tension music during chases, mainly non-diegetic sound such as loud crashes, loud orchestral music. Also eerie music will be used to create a scary feel within the audience when there is a sense of the character being unsure or scared themselves. Also non-diegetic sound will be used during the killings to exaggerate.

SFX: We will consider using action sequences or fake blood and gore.

What is essential.

Write a brief paragraph for each intended sequence that shows an activity. (A sequence is usually delineated by being in one location, one chunk of time, or an assembly of materials to show one topic.) Incorporate the following:

1. What the activity is and what conflict it evidences
2. A metaphor to explain its subtextual meaning
3. The expedited structure of events
4. What the sequence should contribute to the whole film and to the hypothesis
5. What facts the audience must gather from watching it
6. What key, emblematic imagery you hope to capture

Main Characters

Write a brief paragraph about each of your main characters. For each include:

Final packaging. Where do we leave the characters? What happens at the very end? Is there an epilogue? Writing the documentary, of course, differs from a typical film or television show because there are so many unknowns. But if you stick to this structure as hard as possible, you will be in place. Plan your film using 10 professionally designed screenplays as PDFS.IPS ready to use for writing a document, each document is different. Use an active voice and give the reader an idea of what they will see and hear on the screen, as the document unfolds from start to finish. Don't tell me that Apollo was hit by Rocky. This is moving from the past page. Use a vibrant and colorful language and avoid existing sentences or shots. 3. Use a non-lactic language. Not everyone who reads your documentary comment will not be a fan of a film expert or scenario skills. Be sure to use the internal realization conditions that an average player will not understand. 4. Make the correct formatting. Enter the characters in capital letters, then specify their age in parentheses: "Rocks (25) greets Paul (40 years old). Long five. Clouds is the back of Paul rock. 5. Explain what you see and hear on the camera. Do not illuminate the wishes of heroes, emotions or internal thoughts. And definitely do not define the management of the camera. After receiving the first draft from your documentary, get criticism, it's time to show some people. However, avoid sending or interviewing to the sponsors until your friend or employee looks at him. They will probably have useful feedback that will make your treatment even better. better.
