In February I had the privilege of speaking at the Seedline Conference held at First Baptist Church, Milford, Ohio. Their Bearing Precious Seed Ministry printed 350,000 Bulgarian John and Romans for Couriers and assembled and boxed 143,000 in just a few days (pictured above right)!

Shortly they will be printing 150,000 bi-lingual Croatian/English John and Romans and 5,000 Croatian Bibles. Presently the Bible is being formatted and should be ready within a couple of weeks. Please pray with us for its completion, because it takes time to publish, assemble, and box that many Bibles.

All of the above listed scriptures are being prepared for our September campaigns in Bulgaria and Croatia.



to the influence of the Luther Bible. However, the same year the Luther Bible was finished, in 1534, the Jesuit religious order was also founded, and the Jesuits started a counter-reformation. Austria became recatholisized (paganized), and the Protestants and Baptists had to convert back to paganism, flee persecution, or face death. Many Protestant preachers who came to the west of Austria were imprisoned or fled back to Protestant Germany or Switzerland. For many years the main training center of the Jesuits was near Dornbirn, where many Roman Catholic nobility youth were trained in the service of the pope.

We lived six years in this western part of Austria when pastoring in Liechtenstein, and it is spiritually darker than any other place I have been in the German speaking countries. People in western Austria do not have the BOOK or knowledge of the book, due to the lack of Bible teachers.

The last city where the Couriers for Christ campaign was held was Dornbirn, in the west of Austria. We had been forbidden by the police to hold a campaign in the city of Bregenz, which was the original plan. After we had placed ads in the papers and posters on the streets and secured a place to hold the evangelistic meeting, we were denied the use of the building because we were accused of being anti-Semitic. We held a meeting and explained that we are NOT anti-Semitic, but that we LOVE the Jewish people even in their unsaved state. We were able to give Bibles to the owner of the building and to his secretary, even though we had to shift the campaign focus to the city of Dornbirn.

The night of the evangelistic meeting in Dornbirn the music and singing was GREAT, which is the best preparation in the hearts of those who need to hear the gospel. One man, Rudolf, who one of our church members met at the book table we had set up in the center of Dornbirn in the preceding days, came and got saved. A few more people showed interest and kept coming to the follow-up meetings over the last four weeks. Two young men from the south of Austria plan to move to the area, get jobs, and then attend the Bible studies. Please pray for Simon and Chris.

We located a place in the center of Dornbirn where we meet Thursday evenings at 7:30 p.m. and Sunday afternoons at 5:00 p.m. Pray especially for Rudolf, Monday, Ludmilla, Armin and family, Rainer and family, and Joel and family.

The need for a Bible believing work in Roman Catholic Austria is enormous, and we appreciate your help in the good start and continued prayer for this endeavor.


