Back in 2004 Missionary Derek
Thomas, who had started a good solid
church in Vilnius, Lithuania, contacted me
and asked if we would hold a campaign
with him. His purpose was twofold:
First, to distribute scriptures in Vilnius and
to strengthen his existing church.
Second, to reach the city of Ukmerge (population 40,000) and start a church there. At
that time there wasn't a Bible preaching
church of any kind in Ukmerge.

A campaign was organized, and in September of 2004, Couriers for Christ took 27 people to Lithuania to hold a church planting and scripture distribution campaign. Over 55,000 scriptures were distributed in Vilnius and nearly 5,000 in Ukmerge; 550 people attended the Vilnius meeting and 150 in Ukmerge.

The following week Derek started holding a Bible study in Ukmerge. During the first meeting there were about 25 visitors. Each week attendance dropped a little, and about the seventh week the Bible study attendance was down to 11. That evening the

twelfth man came and very sadly handed back to Derek the Bible he had received the night of the evangelistic meeting. Derek told him that it was his Bible and that it was a gift. Then the man explained that the Orthodox priest had told him that he must not read the Bible and he had to return it. Derek spent a couple of hours that evening with that man and persuaded him to keep the Bible and read it because it is God's letter to him. After that evening the Bible study attendance slowly began to grow.

After about one year Derek turned over the Bible study to Brother Kestas, who had been trained by Brother Thomas in his church Bible institute. Brother Kestas and his family have remained faithful to the Lord

and the ministry in Ukmerge. The Ukmerge Baptist Church now runs around 40 people.

For the past ten years the church rented their meeting place from a Christian lady; however, she now wants to sell the building and she has offered it to the church for 40,000 euros (about \$47,500 U.S. dollars at today's exchange rate).

Would you pray about helping Pastor Kestas and Ukmerge Baptist Church purchase this building? Any amount--\$50, \$500, or even \$1,000--would be a tremendous blessing to this ministry in Ukmerge, Lithuania.


