### John and Romans Update

Bearing Precious Seed missionary, Chad Robinson, gave me the following report: Several of the Seedline churches are finishing up production of the Bulgarian John and Romans and promised to have them completed by the end of June. That's 350,000 gospels of John and Romans! With 270 John and Romans per box, that means there will be 1,296 boxes of scripture. That much scripture will fill a container with over 18 tons!

The 150,000 Croatian bilingual John and Romans will be completed and ready to ship by the end of the month as well.

# **Croatian Bible Update**

The printing of the 5,000 Croatian Bibles was completed on June 11. Now the Bibles will be bound and covers will be put on them. They, too, will be ready to ship by early July.

We want to express our gratitude to the Bearing Precious Seed ministry of Milford, Ohio, for printing all this scripture, and also to the Seedline churches for their financial contributions towards the John and Romans and then for assembling and boxing up all those scriptures.

Mid-June: Siauliai, Lithuania


Mid-September: Kiev, Ukraine
