Dear Faithful Supporters,

I've got a lot to tell you about. (So, sorry if it seems choppy.) After a couple months of construction projects and conferences, we have slowed down a bit. We just held our 2nd Annual Ladies' Meeting. Last year, we had 70 women. This year, we changed some things and expected the attendance to drop significantly. Still, we had 60! Stephanie organized it and was the speaker for this years theme: "Redeeming the Time".

My new iPhone was stolen a couple weeks ago. We know who the perpetrator is and are working to recover it. I think he may have skipped town. Pray that I would show mercy and that I could be a witness to him.

Maira has been coming for a little over a month now with her two girls, Roses and Jade. Just last week, I was able to lead Maira to the Lord after the Sunday evening service. We talked to her girls as well, and they were very interested in our discussion but not quite ready to make any decisions. Please keep them in your prayers; they are still young (9 and 11).

Each month, a group of our members goes next door to the boys' home. It is not an orphanage, but rather a home for troubled kids. The property is adjacent to ours and practically surrounds the church's property. We are praying for the director, Gonzalo. He has been gracious to allow us to play some sports with the boys and to preach to them. Since August is the month that the winds come and we prepare for the spring

rains, it's kite season. This past week, we handed out kites to each of the boys, and helped them get 'em in the air. Then I preached on "The Almost Sacrifice of Isaac."

You may remember Beunos Aires from our last letter. I was able to visit again a few weeks ago with a three men from church along with my three older girls. We had a great time, but we saw a lot of confusion in the brethren, mainly because of the Pentecostal influence. Their doctrine is tainted, and their Bible knowledge is very shallow.

From 2nd Samuel 9, I preached on our condition before God and the wonder of salvation. Later, I preached about three hours to the men. They had many questions. I preached a message on the church's being the Pillar and Ground of Truth. That led to other questions and other passages. Those messages then led to more questions. It was an exciting time.



I returned last week and sat down with Pastor Feliciano. We had a sweet time of fellowship. This time, I was able to take up about 24 Bibles from <u>BEAMS</u>. Feliciano was the only one in the village that had one. Well, I expect to bring a few more Bibles next Saturday when we



go back for a Doctrines Class. I think we are seeing the start of a rural institute. Please pray for wisdom and pray for us to be a blessing. Also, the mayor of Nuevo Occoro (five minutes from Buenos Aires) has offered to gather the town for a special meeting when we come. Please pray for the Lord to work through the preaching on Saturday.

We are heading to the US in November. Now, this was going to be a quick trip to spend Christmas with our family States-side. Stephanie's pregancy will push our return date a little further. So now, we are staying through March. Stephanie is doing great. appreciate your prayers for her health and the baby's. Also, please be in prayer for a place to stay while we are there. We will be using **BMTM** again for our furlough vehicle. We are so grateful to Bro. Eric Hargis and his family for helping us now for the third time. Great vans for furlouging missionaries!
