The Evergreen State College will be offering FCC Amateur Radio Licensing classes to Staff, Students and Faculty this Fall according to Jackie LaVerne, Emergency Management

Coordinator at The Evergreen State College.

Evergreen, In cooperation with the Olympia Amateur Radio Society, OARS, is developing a pilot program that hopes to train many, including community members in the authorized use of Amateur Radio or Ham Radio. The goal is to "train up a group of interested people so that their skills can be deployed in the event of a community disaster." Says Jackie who is responsible for disaster preparedness at Evergreen.

Lee Chambers, OARS Vice President will be providing the syllabus for the classes and also the teachers and mentors for the students. "Learning the basic electronics and regulations associated with acquiring FCC Licensing is a part of this education,' says Lee, 'But equally, perhaps more importantly is the history of and proper use of radios for communication."

Classes are expected to start this Fall and days and times will be announced.

WASHINGTON DOT PREPARES FOR AMATEUR RADIO SUPPORT

A brand new HyGain AV680 Vertical Antenna has been erected on top of the Washington Department of Transportation Olympic Region Maintenance HQ facility in Lacey, Washington. This marks the near completion of the development of the alternative communications capability and the relationship between TC ARES and WSDOT.

Augmenting communications and helping to ensure that they have uninterrupted communications in the event of a disaster, WSDOT and TC ARES are working together to develop a network for providing emergency information in the event of grid failure or downed cell phone towers.

Phil Cornell, W7PLC, TC ARES member of the Department of Transportation project team reports that the new vertical antenna will provide High Frequency capabilities from 80 meters to 6 meters.

"The project is nearly complete' says Phil, 'WSDOT will be putting up the VHF/UHF Antenna soon too." Eric Messelt, W8ESM is the project team lead for TC ARES.
