Know Before You Go May 21 General Primary & Nonpartisan Election

This year trained Senior Citizen Council volunteers will visit Cobb Senior Services Centers, sharing information about upcoming elections and reminding seniors to create a voting plan.

You can check your voting status at My Voter Page. This website includes your basic voter information, plus sample ballots, in person voting locations, absentee ballot drop box locations, voter ID requirements, and much more.

- 1. Vote in person on Election Day, at your assigned precinct location
- 2. Vote in person during early voting, at any advance voting location
